To amend sections 3701.57, 3707.34, 3709.012, 3709.02, 3709.03, 3709.07, 3709.071, 3709.08, 3709.09, 3709.10, 3709.19, 3709.28, 3709.35, 3709.41, 3717.25, and 3717.45 and to repeal section 3709.04 of the Revised Code to eliminate district advisory councils for general health districts, and transfer their duties and responsibilities to boards of county commissioners.

### H. B. No. 464 - Representative Wiggam.

To amend section 6109.072 and to repeal section 6109.24 of the Revised Code to eliminate public water system asset management program requirements and to require the Director of Environmental Protection to rescind rules governing that program.

### **H. B. No. 465** - Representatives Sheehy, Bird.

To amend section 5511.01 and to enact section 5517.08 of the Revised Code to establish requirements regarding Department of Transportation projects, specifically as they relate to schools and school zones.
