INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced and considered for the first time:

S. B. No. 14 - Senator Rulli.

To amend sections 3506.01, 3506.04, 3506.05, 3506.06, 3506.07, 3506.10, 3513.041, 3513.05, 3513.262, and 3513.263 and to enact section 3506.16 of the Revised Code to require state approval of voter registration systems for use in Ohio and to modify the law governing protests against candidate filings.

S. B. No. 15 - Senator Wilson.

Cosponsors: Senators Brenner, Schuring.

To enact sections 321.50, 507.14, 733.82, 3354.101, 3357.101, 3358.061, and 3375.361 of the Revised Code to change the circumstances in which certain fiscal officers may be held liable for a loss of public funds.

S. B. No. 16 - Senator Schaffer.

To amend sections 2903.11, 2903.13, 2903.22, 2909.01, 2909.04, 2909.05, 2917.01, 2921.01, 2921.03, 2921.15, 2921.31, 2923.31, and 2929.41 and to enact sections 2307.68, 2909.031, 2917.06, 2917.14, 2921.332, and 2921.333 of the Revised Code regarding a civil action for an emergency service responder based on a civil rights abridgement or false complaint, and certain crimes regarding conduct directed at an actual or perceived emergency service responder, public servant, family member, co-worker, or BCII investigator or at a public emergency.

To amend section 307.04 of the Revised Code to exempt county utility supply contracts entered into under a joint purchasing program from the 10-year maximum period for such contracts and to declare an emergency.

To amend sections 4511.751 and 4511.76 and to enact sections 5.501, 4511.752, 4511.753, 4511.754, 4511.755, 4511.756, and 4511.757 of the Revised Code to impose a civil penalty when a driver who illegally passes a school bus cannot be identified, to designate the month of August as "School Bus Safety Awareness Month," and to designate this act as the School Bus Safety Act.
