**REPORTS OF REFERENCE AND BILLS FOR SECOND
CONSIDERATION**

Senator Huffman, M. reports for the standing committee on Rules and Reference, recommending that the following bills and resolutions, standing in order for second consideration, be referred to committee as recommended:

To urge the United States government to secure its southern border.

To urge that the federal proposal to require financial institutions and other financial service providers to report most customer net account inflows and outflows not be passed or implemented by government officials.
