**A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

To urge the National Collegiate Athletics Association to 1  
restore the vacated wins and records from the 2010 2  
football season of the Ohio State University. 3

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF  
OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):**

WHEREAS, Ohio, numerous other states, and the National 4  
Collegiate Athletics Association have adopted laws and policies 5  
allowing student athletes to receive compensation in connection 6  
with their name, image, and likeness; and 7

WHEREAS, It is proper to re-examine past sanctions which 8  
penalized student-athletes for similar activities; and 9

WHEREAS, The 2010 football season of the Ohio State 10  
University involved the athletic accomplishments of more than 11  
one hundred players, coaches, trainers, and other school 12  
personnel; and 13

WHEREAS, The 2010 Ohio State University football team 14  
earned a 12-1 record, won the Big Ten Championship, and won the 15  
Sugar Bowl; and 16

WHEREAS, The 2010 Ohio State University football team 17

produced a top-five career all-time passer (Terrelle Pryor), a 18  
top-five career all-time receiver (DeVier Posey), a top-ten 19  
career all-time rusher (Daniel "Boom" Herron), and an All- 20  
American (Mike Adams); now therefore be it 21

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the 134th General 22  
Assembly of the State of Ohio, urge the National Collegiate 23  
Athletics Association to restore the vacated wins and records 24  
from the 2010 football season of the Ohio State University; and 25  
be it further 26

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the House of Representatives 27  
shall transmit duly authenticated copies of this resolution to 28  
the National Collegiate Athletics Association and the news media 29  
of Ohio. 30
