# BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

WHEREAS, There are more than 16,000 citizens in the Ohio	7
Army National Guard and Ohio Air National Guard, which make up	8
the nation's fourth-largest National Guard; and	9
WHEREAS, Ohio National Guard members work and live in	10
nearly every community across the state and have a proven track	11
record of success supporting civilian authorities during and	
after homeland emergencies; and	
WHEREAS, The Ohio National Guard members helped evacuate	14
stranded motorists, delivered supplies, and cleared snow from	15
roadways during the 1978 blizzard that hit Ohio; and	16
WHEREAS, The Ohio National Guard distributed vital	17
vaccinations and medical supplies during the 2009 H1N1 pandemic;	18

In addition, 25 more than 350 Guard members supported medical testing; and 26 WHEREAS, More than 1,000 Ohio National Army and Air 27 National Guard members supported missions to limit the spread of 28 the coronavirus, collecting test samples, warehousing personal 29 protective equipment (PPE) and vaccines, and distributing food 30 at medical facilities; and 31 WHEREAS, The Ohio National Guard supported 15 testing 32 locations across the state as part of efforts to ease some of 33

WHEREAS, During the 2017 hurricane season, more than 400 Ohio National Guard members deployed to Texas, Florida, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and Puerto Rico to assist in recovery efforts; and 34

WHEREAS, Since March 23, 2020, the Ohio National Guard,43along with members of the Ohio Military Reserve, have supported44humanitarian efforts in regional food distribution warehouses45and local food banks throughout the state, which combined46provide food to Ohioans in all 88 counties; and47

WHEREAS, Ohio National Guard member food bank support48includes service at Akron-Canton Regional Foodbank (Akron/Summit49County), Freestore Foodbank (Cincinnati/Hamilton County),50

WHEREAS, The Ohio National Guard supported the Ohio 63 Department of Rehabilitation and Correction with various 64 resources including staffing augmentation, medical care, and 65 erection of temporary housing. Facilities supported have 66 included all of the following: Belmont Correctional Institution, 67 Chillicothe Correctional Institution, Correctional Reception 68 Center, Cuyahoga County Jail, Elkton Federal Corrections 69 Institution, Franklin County Jail, Grafton Correctional 70 Institution, Lorain Correctional Institution, Madison 71 Correctional Institution, Mansfield Correctional Institution, 72 Marion Correctional Institution, Northeast Reintegration Center, 73 Ohio Reformatory for Women, Pickaway Correctional Institution, 74 Richland Correctional Institution, Ross Correctional 75 Institution, and Trumbull Correctional Institution; and 76

WHEREAS, Ohio National Guard medical staff, consisting of77medics and nurses, were instrumental in assisting a Logan long-78term health care facility during the COVID-19 pandemic, standing79in for facility staff who were in quarantine, and preventing the80necessity to relocate residents. Ohio National Guard medical81staff were responsible for tasks such as administering82medications, assessing conditions, taking vital signs, and83
