A RESOLUTION

Observing April 2022 as the Month of the Military Child in Ohio.

WHEREAS, The members of the Senate of the 134th General Assembly 1 of Ohio are pleased to recognize the Month of the Military Child in Ohio, April 2022; and 3

WHEREAS, In an effort to increase public knowledge and understanding of the issues surrounding children who have a parent in the military, the month of April was first designated by then U.S. Secretary of Defense Caspar Weinberger as the Month of the Military Child in 1986.
