A RESOLUTION

Honoring June 19, 2022 as Juneteenth Day.

WHEREAS, The members of the Senate of the 134th General Assembly of Ohio are pleased to recognize June 19, 2022 as Juneteenth Day and celebrate the First Anniversary of its establishment; and 3 WHEREAS, On September 22, 1862, President Abraham Lincoln 4 issued a preliminary proclamation notifying the people of the Southern states that if they did not return to the 6 Union by January 1, 1863, they would be in rebellion 7 against the United States, and he would declare their 8 slaves "forever free." The final Emancipation Proclamation was issued on January 1, 1863, formally declaring all 10 slaves free, and on June 19, 1865, Union General Gordon Granger and 11 his troops arrived in Galveston, Texas, with this news of freedom. 12 Juneteenth commemorates this day when the last slaves in America 13 learned of their emancipation; and 14 WHEREAS, First recognized by the State of Ohio in 2006, Juneteenth 15 was formally established as a public holiday by the Juneteenth 16 National Independence Day Act on June 17, 2021, and it pays tribute to 17 African-American freedom while encouraging equality in housing, 18 education, healthcare, policing, and the criminal justice system. 19 Indeed, all Ohioans should feel encouraged by this event to reexamine 20 American history, to reflect on the struggles of the past to ensure 21 liberty and fairness for all citizens, and to recommit themselves 22 toward building a better future for the generations yet to come; and 23
