WHEREAS, Gretchen Whitmer is the Governor of Mich	nigan, and 5	
Dan Eichinger is the Director of the Michigan Departme	ent of 6

WHEREAS, In 1953, the State of Michigan granted a	an easement 8	
to Lakehead Pipe Line Company, Inc., and its successo	rs and 9	
assigns (hereinafter the 1953 Easement); and	10	
WHEREAS, Enbridge is an energy delivery company, successor to Lakehead Pipe Line Company, Inc.; and	and 11 12	
WHEREAS, The 1953 Easement allowed the constructi	.on, 13	
operation, and maintenance of dual petroleum pipeline	s through 14	
the Straits of Mackinac; and	15	
WHEREAS, Enbridge now maintains and operates the	pipeline 16	

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#### constructed pursuant to the 1953 Easement, known as the Enbridge 17 Line 5 pipeline (hereinafter Line 5); and 18 WHEREAS, Line 5 supports Enbridge in providing the crude 19 oil refined at PBF Energys Toledo Refining Co. plant and the BP-20 Husky Toledo Refinery, both in Oregon, Ohio; and 21 WHEREAS, PBF Energys Toledo Refining Co. employs 585 people 22 and the BP-Husky Toledo Refinery employs 625 people; and 23 WHEREAS, The United States has lost substantial oil 24 refining capacity due to COVID-19 and the loss of demand it 25 created; and 26 WHEREAS, Without service from The closure of Line 57 will 27 <u>significantly impact operations at PBF Energys Energy's Toledo</u> 28 Refining Co. plant and the BP-Husky Toledo Refinery are likely 29 to, and could potentially close permanently a refinery, leaving 30 1,210 hundreds of hard-working Ohioans unemployed; and 31 WHEREAS, PBF Energy's Toledo Refining Co. plant and the BP-32 Husky Toledo Refinery engage contractors who employ hundreds 33 more blue-collar workers for ongoing construction, safety 34 upgrades, and maintenance upgrades; and 35 WHEREAS, The loss of additional oil refining capacity will 36 leave the United State more dependent on foreign sources of 37 refined oil products; and 38 WHEREAS, Enbridge has committed to a \$500 million project 39 to replace the current pipelines that run through the Straights 40 of Mackinac with a new tunnel and line buried four hundred feet 41 beneath the Straights; and 42 WHEREAS, Enbridge has committed to use steel made in the 43 United States, pipe fabricated in the United States, and union 44 labor for construction on the replacement project; now therefore 45 be it 46
