support the PROTECT Our Children Act of 2022.

2008, authorized the Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC)	4
Task Force Program, a national network of 61 coordinated task	5
forces that represent 3,500 federal, state, and local law	6
enforcement and prosecutorial agencies engaged in reactive and	7
proactive investigations across the country; and	8
WHEREAS, The ICAC aids local and state law enforcement in	9
the creation and implementation of effective responses to	10
technology-facilitated child sexual exploitation and internet	11
crimes against children; and	12
WHEREAS, In order to develop effective response strategies	13
to online child victimization, the ICAC offers guidance on	14
victim support, forensic and investigative components, training	15
and technical assistance, and prevention and community	16
education; and	17
WHEREAS, The PROTECT Our Children Act of 2022 (S.4834 of	18
the 117th Congress) reauthorizes through fiscal year 2024 the	19
ICAC Task Force Program; now therefore be it	20
