To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section	1
4503.598 of the Revised Code to create the	2
"Jackson Local Schools" license plate.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section			
4503.598 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5		
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6		
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7		
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	8		
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	9		
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	10		
in division (B) of this section.	11		
(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	12		
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	13		
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	14		
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast	15		
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	16		
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	17		
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to	18		
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of	19		

the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20 other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40 directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar42receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the43national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money44it receives under this section to assist those who have45pancreatic cancer and their families.46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar47receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the48

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Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the49contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social50support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar52receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the53St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for54its research and other programs.55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56 receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 57 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 58 for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar60receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the61children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the62contributions for its research and other programs.63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar64receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to65the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to66raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic67pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 75 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76 contributions into its general account to be used for 77

educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of America foundation. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay

the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 85 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87 scholarships and other educational activities. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92 that organization. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94 receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95 Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96 scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 97 events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received99pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio100aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to101facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational102programming.103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received104pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the105organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that106

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organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 107 need.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 109 receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 110 kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 111 Ohio chapters of a kid again. 112

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 113 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 114 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 115 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 116 section. A university or college that receives contributions 117 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 118 scholarship fund. 119

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 120 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 121 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 122 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 123 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 124 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 125 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 126 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 127 funds as provided in this section. 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129 receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 130 Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 131 of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 132 attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 133 funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 134 program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 135 with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 136

funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 138 receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 139 university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 140 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 141 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 142 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 143 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 144 university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 145 146 funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar147receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the148Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the149contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign.150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen advocates for addiction recovery).

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 156 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 157 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 158 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 159 cyclists of all ages. 160

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar161receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the162"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial,163incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws164of this state, to assist that organization in paying the165

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expenses it i	ncurs in sponsorin	g or holding	g charitable, 16	6
educational,	and cultural event	s at the mor	nument. 16	57

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 168 receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 169 fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 170 the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 171 lighthouses of fairport harbor. 172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 173 receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 174 Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 175 contributions only to promote and support the football team of 176 Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 178 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 179 United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 180 distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 181 States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 182 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 183 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 184 sponsors within this state. 185

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 186 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 187 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 188 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 189 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian activities. 191

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 192 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 193 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 194

under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 195
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 196
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 197

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 198 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 199 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 200 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 201 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 202 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 203 204 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 205 the improvement of patient outcomes. 206

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 207 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 208 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 209 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 210 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 211 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 212 personnel, veterans, and their families. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214 receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 215 Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 216 the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 217

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 218 receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 219 nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 220 health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 221 further the nonprofit's mission. 222

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 224 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 225 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 226 families. 227

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 241 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 242 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 243 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 244 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 245 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 246 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 247 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 248 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 249 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 250 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 251

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar252receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the253

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rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 255 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 256 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 257 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 258 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 259 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 260 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 261 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 262 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 263 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 264 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 265 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 266 under this section. 2.67

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar273receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the274western reserve historical society, which shall use the275contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar277receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the278Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple279negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the280contributions for charitable and educational purposes.281

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 282

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receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 283 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 284 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 285 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 286 the person who paid the contribution resides. 287

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 288 receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to 289 playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use 290 the contributions to further its mission of presenting and 291 producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing 292 arts education, and creating a superior destination for 293 entertainment, business, and residential living. 294

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 295 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 296 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 297 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 298 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 299 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 300 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 301 302 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 303 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 304 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 305 such payments are to be made. 306

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 313 Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 314 nature preserve. 315

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 316 receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 317 conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 318 the money in support of the park. 319

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar320receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the321Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the322contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.323

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar324receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the325girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the326contributions to support the activities of the organization.327

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 328 receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the 329 Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use 330 the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and 331 rehabilitation, and educational programs. 332

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 333 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 334 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 335 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 336 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 337 local beekeeping programs. 338

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar339receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the340national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the341

legends to inspire future leaders.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 344 receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 345 keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 346 contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 347 to take greater responsibility for improving the local 348 environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 349 greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 350

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 351 receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 352 national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 353 the contributions for educational purposes. 354

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 355 receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 356 Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 357 contributions to support the activities of the organization. 358

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 359 receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 360 progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 361 shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 362 center. 363

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar368receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the369Ohio oil and gas energy education foundation to fund370

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scholarships for students pursuing careers in the oil and371natural gas industry.372The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created373

pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each374contribution the registrar receives under that section that an375applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a376professional sports team located in the county of that sports377commission and that is participating in the license plate378program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective379of the county of residence of an applicant.380

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each381contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of382the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates383that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is384participating in the license plate program pursuant to division385(G) of that section.386

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 387 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 388 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 389 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 390 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 391 Ohio and for educational programs. 392

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 393 receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 394 pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 395 supporting cancer research. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar397receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the398Stan Hywet hall and gardens.399

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 400 receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 401 Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 402

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 403 receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 404 Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 405 contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 406 pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 407

408 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.598 of the Revised Code 409 equally to the Jackson local schools foundation and the Jackson 410 high school alumni association. The foundation and alumni 411 association shall use the contributions for the foundation's and alumni association's purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 419 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 420 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 421 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 422 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 423 scouts. 424

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 425 receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 426 Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 427 shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 428

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throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the

charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 432 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 433

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar434receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the435Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,436which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.437

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 438 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 439 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 440 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 441 charitable purposes. 442

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 446 receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the 447 Antioch shrine foundation located in the municipal corporation 448 of Dayton. 449

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar450receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the451fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall452deposit the fees into its general account to be used for453purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.454

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar455receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the456fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall457

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deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 458 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 459 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 460 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 461 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 462 pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 463 concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 464 contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 465 to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 466 in the line of duty. 467 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 468 pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 469 Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 470 contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 471 the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 472 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 473 pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 474 association of chiefs of police. 475

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 476 receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.715 of the 477 Revised Code to the community foundation of Ohio's electric 478 cooperatives, which shall use the contributions to recognize and 479 memorialize fallen or injured lineworkers and support their 480 families. 481

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar482receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the483fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall484use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.485

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 486

receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 487 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 488 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 489 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 490 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 491 administering a program to secure the proper representation in 492 the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 493 children, and for the training and supervision of persons 494 participating in that program. 495

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 500 receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 501 Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 502 which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 503 advocacy purposes throughout the state. 504

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 505 receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 506 ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 507 split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 508 association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 509 agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 510 be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 511 advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 512 lives to the fullest. 513

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar514receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to515Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the516

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contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 517 of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 518

The school shall ensure that any such charitable1058organization is exempt from federal income taxation under1059subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school1060shall not use the contributions it receives for any other1061purpose.1062

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1063 receives pursuant to section 4503.953 of the Revised Code to 1064 Gilmour academy located in the municipal corporation of Gates 1065 Mills. The school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions 1066 it receives to provide tuition assistance to its students. The 1067 school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the 1068 expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 1069 students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 1070 emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 1071 include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 1072 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 1073 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 1074 abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1075 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1076 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 1077 services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 1078 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 1079 charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 1080 services. The school shall use the remaining 1091 fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in providing 1092 services to the school's students that assist in developing or 1093 maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. 1094 The services provided may include bereavement counseling, 1095 instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity 1096 training, and the counseling and education of students regarding 1097 bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and 1098 human trafficking. As a part of providing such services, the 1099 school may pay for members of the faculty of the school to 1100 receive training in providing those services. The school 1101 principal or, in the school principal's discretion, appropriate 1102 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 1103 that the school hires to provide those services. The school 1104 shall ensure that any such charitable organization is exempt 1105 from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 1106 Internal Revenue Code. The school shall not use the 1107 contributions it receives for any other purpose. 1108

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1109 receives pursuant to section 4503.955 of the Revised Code to 1110 Saint Albert the Great school located in North Royalton. The 1111 school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives 1112 to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall 1113 use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs 1114 in providing services to the school's students that assist in 1115 developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of 1116 the students. The services provided may include bereavement 1117 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 1118 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 1119

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students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 1120 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1121 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1122 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 1123 services. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school 1139 shall not use the contributions it receives for any political 1140

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1142 receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1143 Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1144 Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1145 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1146 students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1147 arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1148 the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1149

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1150receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to1151Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal1152corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the1153contributions for any political purpose.1154

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1155receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to1156Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of1157Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for1158any political purpose.1159

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1160receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to1161Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The1162high school shall not use the contributions for any political1163purpose.1164

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1165receives pursuant to section 4503.964 of the Revised Code to1166Chardon hilltopper gridiron club. The club shall use1167contributions to fund college and career technical training1168scholarships for students.1169

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1170receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the1171friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money1172to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free1173emergency medical first response throughout Israel.1174

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1175receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the1176Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and1177activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the1178

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city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1179 (C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1180 contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1181 the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1182 distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1183 section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1184 calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1185 entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1186 received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1187

Sec. 4503.598. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1188 car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1189 vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1190 may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1191 and issuance of "Jackson Local Schools" license plates. The 1192 application may be combined with a request for a special 1193 reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the 1194 Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and 1195 compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this 1196 section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 1197 appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Jackson Local 1198 Schools" license plates and a validation sticker, or a 1199 validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of 1200 the Revised Code. 1201

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily1202inscribed on the license plates, "Jackson Local Schools" license1203plates shall display an appropriate logo and words selected by1204representatives of the Jackson local school district that are1205approved by the registrar. "Jackson Local Schools" license1206plates shall display county identification stickers that1207identify the county of registration as required under section1208

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4503.19 of the Revised Code.

(B) "Jackson Local Schools" license plates and a validation sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle under this section; payment of the regular license tax as prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as provided in division (C) (1) of this section; and compliance with

all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor1220vehicles.1221

(C) (1) For each application for registration and1222registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this1223section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of thirty1224dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the1225state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution1226fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code.1227

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of1228ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau1229for additional services required in the issuing of "Jackson1230Local Schools" license plates, into the state treasury to the1231credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund created in1232section 4501.06 of the Revised Code.1233

Section 2. That existing section 4501.21 of the Revised1234Code is hereby repealed.1235

Section 3. Section 4501.21 of the Revised Code is1236presented in this act as a composite of the section as amended1237

by H.B. 74, H.B. 110, H.B. 281, H.B. 291, and H.B. 578, all of 1238 the 134th General Assembly. The General Assembly, applying the 1239 principle stated in division (B) of section 1.52 of the Revised 1240 Code that amendments are to be harmonized if reasonably capable 1241 of simultaneous operation, finds that the composite is the 1242 resulting version of the section in effect prior to the 1243 effective date of the section as presented in this act. 1244

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
