A BILL

To amend sect	ion 3313.6114	of the Re	evised Code	to 1
revise the	Military Enl	istment di	iploma seal.	2

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3313.6114 of the Revised Code be	3
amended to read as follows:	4
Sec. 3313.6114. (A) The state board of education shall	5
establish a system of state diploma seals for the purposes of	6
allowing a student to qualify for graduation under section	7
3313.618 of the Revised Code. State diploma seals may be	8
attached or affixed to the high school diploma of a student	9
enrolled in a public or chartered nonpublic school. The system	10
of state diploma seals shall consist of all of the following:	11
(1) The state seal of biliteracy established under section	12
3313.6111 of the Revised Code;	13
(2) The OhioMeansJobs-readiness seal established under	14
section 3313.6112 of the Revised Code;	15
(3) The state diploma seals prescribed under division (C)	16

of this section.

(B) A school district, community school established under 18 Chapter 3314. of the Revised Code, STEM school established under 19 Chapter 3326. of the Revised Code, college-preparatory boarding 20 school established under Chapter 3328. of the Revised Code, or 21 chartered nonpublic school shall attach or affix the state seals 22 prescribed under division (C) of this section to the diploma and 23 transcript of a student enrolled in the district or school who 24 25 meets the requirements established under that division.

(C) The state board shall establish all of the following state diploma seals:

(1) An industry-recognized credential seal. A student shall meet the requirement for this seal by doing either of the following:

(a) Earning an industry-recognized credential, or group of credentials, approved under section 3313.6113 of the RevisedCode that is both of the following:

(i) At least equal to the total number of pointsestablished under section 3313.6113 of the Revised Code toqualify for a high school diploma;

(ii) Aligned to a job that is determined to be in demand in this state and its regions under section 6301.11 of the Revised Code.

(b) Obtaining a license approved under section 3313.6113

of the Revised Code that is issued by a state agency or board
for practice in a vocation that requires an examination for

government end-of-course examinations prescribed under division	67			
(B)(2) of section 3301.0712 of the Revised Code;	68

(e) In the case of a student who transfers into an Ohio 87 public or chartered nonpublic high school from another state or 88 who enrolls in an Ohio public or chartered nonpublic high school 89 after receiving home instruction or attending a nonchartered, 90 nontax-supported school in the previous school year, attaining a 91 final course grade that is the equivalent of a "B" or higher in 92 courses that correspond with the American history and American 93 government end-of-course examinations and that the student 94 completed in the state from which the student transferred or 95 completed while receiving home instruction or attending a 96 nonchartered, nontax-supported school. Division (C)(4)(e) of 97 this section does not apply to any such student with respect to 98 an American history or American government course for which an 99 end-of-course examination is associated that the student takes 100 after enrolling in the high school. 101

(5) A science seal. A student shall meet the requirementfor this seal by doing any of the following:103

(a) Demonstrating at least a proficient level of skill as
prescribed under division (B) (5) (a) of section 3301.0712 of the
Revised Code on the science end-of-course examination prescribed

under division (B) (2) of section 3301.0712 of the Revised Code;

(b) Attaining a score level prescribed under division (B)
(5) (d) of section 3301.0712 of the Revised Code that is at least
109 the equivalent of a proficient level of skill in an appropriate

(c) In lieu of the science end-of-course examination,
attaining a final course grade that is the equivalent of a "B"
or higher in either:

(i) A science course listed in divisions (C) (5) (c) (i) to(iii) of section 3313.603 of the Revised Code that is offered bythe student's high school;

(ii) An appropriate course taken through the collegecredit plus program established under Chapter 3365. of theRevised Code.

(d) In the case of a student who takes an alternate
assessment in accordance with division (C) (1) of section
3301.0711 of the Revised Code, attaining a score established by

(e) In the case of a student who transfers into an Ohio
public or chartered nonpublic high school from another state or
enrolls in an Ohio public or chartered nonpublic high school
after receiving home instruction or attending a nonchartered,
nontax-supported school in the previous school year, attaining a

final course grade that is the equivalent of a "B" or higher in 131 a course that corresponds with the science end-of-course 132 examination and that the student completed in the state from 133 which the student transferred or completed while receiving home 134 instruction or attending a nonchartered, nontax-supported 135 school. Division (C)(5)(e) of this section does not apply to any 136 such student who takes a science course for which an end-of-137 course examination is associated after enrolling in the high 138 school. 139

(6) An honors diploma seal. A student shall meet the requirement for this seal by meeting the additional criteria for an honors diploma under division (B) of section 3313.61 of the Revised Code.

(7) A technology seal. A student shall meet therequirement for this seal by doing any of the following:145

(a) Subject to division (B) (5) (d) of section 3301.0712 of

the Revised Code, attaining a score level that is at least the
147
equivalent of a proficient level of skill in an appropriate
148
advanced placement or international baccalaureate examination;

(b) Attaining a final course grade that is the equivalent
of a "B" or higher in an appropriate course taken through the
151
college credit plus program established under Chapter 3365. of
152
the Revised Code;

(c) Completing a course offered through the student's
district or school that meets guidelines developed by the
department of education. However, a district or school shall not
be required to offer a course that meets guidelines developed by
the department.

(d) In the case of a student who transfers into an Ohio

public or chartered nonpublic high school from another state or 160 enrolls in an Ohio public or chartered nonpublic high school 161 after receiving home instruction or attending a nonchartered, 162 nontax-supported school in the previous school year, attaining a 163 final course grade that is the equivalent of a "B" or higher in 164 an appropriate course, as determined by the district or school, 165 that the student completed in the state from which the student 166 transferred or completed while receiving home instruction or 167 attending a nonchartered, nontax-supported school. 168

(8) A community service seal. A student shall meet the 169 requirement for this seal by completing a community service 170 project that is aligned with guidelines adopted by the student's 171 district board or school governing authority. 172

(9) A fine and performing arts seal. A student shall meet 173 the requirement for this seal by demonstrating skill in the fine 174 or performing arts according to an evaluation that is aligned 175 with guidelines adopted by the student's district board or 176 school governing authority.

(10) A student engagement seal. A student shall meet the 178 requirement for this seal by participating in extracurricular 179 activities such as athletics, clubs, or student government to a 180 meaningful extent, as determined by guidelines adopted by the 181 student's district board or school governing authority. 182

(D) (1) Each district or school shall develop guidelines 183 for at least one of the state seals prescribed under divisions 184 (C)(8) to (10) of this section. 185

(2) For the purposes of determining whether a student who 186 transfers to a district or school has satisfied the state 187 diploma seal requirement under division (B)(2) of section 188

3313.618 of the Revised Code, each district or school shall
189
recognize a state diploma seal prescribed under divisions (C) (8)
190
to (10) of this section and earned by a student at another
191
district or a different public or chartered nonpublic school
192
regardless of whether the district or school to which the
193
student transfers has developed guidelines under this section
194
for that state seal.

(3) In guidelines developed for a state diploma seal 196 prescribed under divisions (C)(8) to (10) of this section, each 197 district or school shall include a method to give, to the extent 198 feasible, a student who transfers into the district or school a 199 proportional amount of credit for any progress the student was 200 making toward earning that state seal at the school district or 201 different public or chartered nonpublic school from which the 202 student transfers. 203

(E) Each district or school shall maintain appropriate
204
records to identify students who have met the requirements
205
prescribed under division (C) of this section for earning the
206
state seals established under that division.
207

(F) The department shall prepare and deliver to each
district or school an appropriate mechanism for assigning a
state diploma seal established under division (C) of this
section.

(G) A student shall not be charged a fee to be assigned a 212
state seal prescribed under division (C) of this section on the 213
student's diploma and transcript. 214

Section 2. That existing section 3313.6114 of the Revised 215 Code is hereby repealed. 216
