A BILL

To amend sections 4501.21 and 4503.725 and to enact
section 5534.847 of the Revised Code to update
the name of one organization receiving
contributions for the "ALS Awareness" license
plate and designate a portion of State Route 60
in Muskingum County as the "Sgt Bradley J.
Harper USMC Memorial Highway." 1
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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4501.21 and 4503.725 be amended
and section 5534.847 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as
follows: 8
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Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 11
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by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 14
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 15
in division (B) of this section. 16

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 17
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 18

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 19
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 20
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 21
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 22
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 23
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 24
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 25
other abortion-related activities. 26

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 27
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 28
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 29
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 30
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 31
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 32
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 33
other money in that fund. 34

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 35
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 36
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 37
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 38

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 39
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 40
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 41
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 42

chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 43
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 44
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 45
directly to their clients. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 47
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 48
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 49
it receives under this section to assist those who have 50
pancreatic cancer and their families. 51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 52
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 53
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 54
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 55
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 56

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 57
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 58
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 59
its research and other programs. 60

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 61
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 62
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 63
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 64

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 65
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 66
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 67
contributions for its research and other programs. 68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 70
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 71

raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 72
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 75
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 76
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 77
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 78

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 79
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 80
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 81
contributions into its general account to be used for 82
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 83
America foundation. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 85
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 86
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 87
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 88
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 89

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 90
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 91
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 92
scholarships and other educational activities. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 94
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 95
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 96
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 97
that organization. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 99
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 100

Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 101
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 102
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 104
pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 105
aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 106
facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 107
programming. 108

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 109
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 110
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 111
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 112
need. 113

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 114
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 115
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 116
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 117

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 118
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 119
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 120
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 121
section. A university or college that receives contributions 122
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 123
scholarship fund. 124

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 125
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 126
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 127
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 128
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 129

receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 130
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 131
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 132
funds as provided in this section. 133

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 134
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 135
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 136
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 137
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 138
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 139
program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 140
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 141
funds as provided in this section. 142

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 143
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 144
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 145
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 146
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 147
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 148
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 149
university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 150
funds as provided in this section. 151

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 152
receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 153
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 154
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 155

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 156
receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code 157
equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of 158
Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen 159

advocates for addiction recovery). 160

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 161
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 162
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 163
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 164
cyclists of all ages. 165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 167
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 168
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 169
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 170
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 171
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 173
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 174
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 175
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 176
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 178
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 179
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 180
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 181
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 182

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 183
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 184
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 185
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 186
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 187
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 188

pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 189
sponsors within this state. 190

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 191
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 192
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 193
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 194
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 195
activities. 196

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 197
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 198
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 199
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 200
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 201
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 202

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 203
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 204
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 205
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 206
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 207
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 208
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 209
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 210
the improvement of patient outcomes. 211

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 212
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 213
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 214
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 215
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 216
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 217
personnel, veterans, and their families. 218

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to further the nonprofit's mission.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section

4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 248
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 249
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 250
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 251
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 252
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 253
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 254
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 255
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 256

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 257
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 258
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 259

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 260
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 261
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 262
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 263
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 264
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 265
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 266
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 267
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 268
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 269
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 270
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 271
under this section. 272

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 273
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 274
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 275
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 276
programs. 277

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the western reserve historical society, which shall use the contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the contributions for charitable and educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use the contributions to further its mission of presenting and producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing arts education, and creating a superior destination for entertainment, business, and residential living.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and

managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 308
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 309
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 310
such payments are to be made. 311

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 312
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 313
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 314
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 315
river watershed. 316

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 317
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 318
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 319
nature preserve. 320

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 321
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 322
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 323
the money in support of the park. 324

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 325
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 326
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 327
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 328

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 329
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 330
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 331
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 332

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 333
receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the 334
Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use 335
the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and 336

rehabilitation, and educational programs. 337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 338
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 339
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 340
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 341
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 342
local beekeeping programs. 343

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 344
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 345
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 346
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 347
legends to inspire future leaders. 348

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 349
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 350
keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 351
contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 352
to take greater responsibility for improving the local 353
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 354
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 355

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 356
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 357
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 358
the contributions for educational purposes. 359

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 360
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 361
Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 362
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 363

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 364
receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 365

progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 366
shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 367
center. 368

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 369
receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the 370
American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the 371
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 372

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 373
receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the 374
Ohio natural energy institute to fund scholarships for students 375
pursuing careers in the oil and natural gas industry. 376

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 377
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 378
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 379
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 380
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 381
commission and that is participating in the license plate 382
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 383
of the county of residence of an applicant. 384

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 385
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 386
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 387
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 388
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 389
(G) of that section. 390

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 391
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 392
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 393
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 394

preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 395
Ohio and for educational programs. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 397
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 398
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 399
supporting cancer research. 400

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 401
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 402
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 403

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 404
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 405
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 406

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 407
receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 408
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 409
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 410
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 411

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 412
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 413
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 414
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 415
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 416

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 417
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 418
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 419
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 420
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 421
scouts. 422

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 423

receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 424
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 425
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 426
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 427

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 428
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 429
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 430
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 431

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 432
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 433
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 434
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 435

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 436
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 437
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 438
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 439
charitable purposes. 440

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 441
receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the 442
Ohio state moose association. 443

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 444
receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the 445
Antioch shrine foundation located in the municipal corporation 446
of Dayton. 447

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 448
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 449
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 450
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 451
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 452

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 453
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 454
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 455
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 456
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 457
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 458
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 459

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 460
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 461
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 462
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 463
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 464
in the line of duty. 465

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 466
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 467
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 468
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 469
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 470

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 471
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 472
association of chiefs of police. 473

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 474
receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.715 of the 475
Revised Code to the community foundation of Ohio's electric 476
cooperatives, which shall use the contributions to recognize and 477
memorialize fallen or injured lineworkers and support their 478
families. 479

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 480
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 481

fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 482
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 483

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 484
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 485
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 486
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 487
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 488
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 489
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 490
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 491
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 492
participating in that program. 493

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 494
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 495
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 496
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 497

Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1143
Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1144
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1145

students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1146
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1147
the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1148

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1149
receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1150
Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1151
corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1152
contributions for any political purpose. 1153

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1154
receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1155
Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1156
Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1157
any political purpose. 1158

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1159
receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1160
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1161
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1162
purpose. 1163

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1164
receives pursuant to section 4503.964 of the Revised Code to 1165
Chardon hilltopper gridiron club. The club shall use 1166
contributions to fund college and career technical training 1167
scholarships for students. 1168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1169
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1170
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1171
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1172
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1173

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1174

receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1175
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1176
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1177
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1178

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1179
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1180
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1181
distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1182
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1183
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1184
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1185

Sec. 4503.725. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1187
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1188
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1189
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1190
and issuance of "ALS Awareness" license plates. The application 1191
may be combined with a request for a special reserved license 1192
plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon 1193
receipt of the completed application and compliance by the 1194
applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the 1195
registrar shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle 1196

Ohio chapter, and that are approved by the registrar. "ALS
Awareness" license plates shall display county identification
stickers that identify the county of registration as required

(B) "ALS Awareness" license plates and a validation
sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon
receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle
under this section; payment of the regular license tax as
prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504.
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor
vehicles.

(C)(1) For each application for registration and
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of twenty-
five dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into
the state treasury to the credit of the license plate
contribution fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised
Code.

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing
of "ALS Awareness" license plates, into the state treasury to
the credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund created
in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code.

Sec. 5534.847. In addition to any other name prescribed in 1234

the Revised Code or otherwise, the northbound and southbound 1235
lanes of state route number sixty, between the intersection of 1236
that route and main street, south of the municipal corporation 1237
of Dresden, and the intersection of that route and state route 1238
number sixteen, in Muskingum county, shall be known as the "Sgt 1239
Bradley J. Harper USMC Memorial Highway." 1240

The director of transportation may erect suitable markers 1241
along the highway indicating its name. 1242
