## A BILL

То	amend section 121.083 and to enact section	1
	4177.01 of the Revised Code to require the	2
	Director of Commerce to establish an indoor mold	3
	program.	4

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 121.083 be amended and section	5
4177.01 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	6
Sec. 121.083. (A) The superintendent of industrial	7
compliance in the department of commerce shall do all of the	8
following:	9
(1) Administer and enforce the general laws of this state	10
pertaining to buildings, pressure piping, boilers, bedding,	11
upholstered furniture, and stuffed toys, steam engineering,	12
elevators, plumbing, licensed occupations regulated by the	13
department, and travel agents, as they apply to plans review,	14
inspection, code enforcement, testing, licensing, registration,	15
and certification.	16

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(2) Exercise the powers and perform the duties delegated	17	
to the superintendent by the director of commerce under Chapters	18	
4109., 4111., and 4115., and 4177. of the Revised Code.	19	
(3) Collect and collate statistics as are necessary.	20	
(4) Examine and license persons who desire to act as steam	21	
engineers, to operate steam boilers, and to act as inspectors of	22	
steam boilers, provide for the scope, conduct, and time of such	23	
examinations, provide for, regulate, and enforce the renewal and	24	
revocation of such licenses, inspect and examine steam boilers	25	
and make, publish, and enforce rules and orders for the	26	
construction, installation, inspection, and operation of steam	27	
boilers, and do, require, and enforce all things necessary to	28	
make such examination, inspection, and requirement efficient.	29	
(5) Rent and furnish offices as needed in cities in this	30	
state for the conduct of its affairs.	31	
(6) Oversee a chief of construction and compliance, a	32	
chief of operations and maintenance, a chief of licensing and	33	
certification, a chief of worker protection, and other designees	34	
appointed by the director to perform the duties described in	35	
this section.	36	
(7) Enforce the rules the board of building standards	37	
adopts pursuant to division (A)(2) of section 4104.43 of the	38	
Revised Code under the circumstances described in division (D)	39	
of that section.	40	
(8) Accept submissions, establish a fee for submissions,	41	
and review submissions of certified welding and brazing	42	
procedure specifications, procedure qualification records, and		
performance qualification records for building services piping		
as required by section 4104.44 of the Revised Code.		

(B) The superintendent may enter into a contract with a	4 6
municipal corporation, township, or county building department	47
certified by the board of building standards pursuant to	48
division (E) of section 3781.10 of the Revised Code, or a	4.9
municipal or county health district, to do any of the following	50
on behalf of the building department or health district:	51
(1) Exercise enforcement authority pursuant to section	52
3781.03 of the Revised Code;	53
(2) Accept and approve plans and specifications, and make	54
inspections, pursuant to section 3791.04 of the Revised Code;	55
(3) Enforce the rules adopted pursuant to division (A)(2)	56
of section 4104.43 of the Revised Code.	57
Sec. 4177.01. (A) As used in this section, "mold" means	58
microscopic organisms or fungi that can grow in damp conditions	59
in the interior of a building, including important mycotoxin-	60
producing organisms, such as stachybotrys chartarum, chaetomium	61
globosum, and aspergillus versicolor.	62
(B) The director of commerce shall establish a mold	63
information and awareness program to assist the public in	64
understanding the threat of mold in buildings and the importance	65
of the proper removal of that mold. As part of the program, the	66
director shall do both of the following:	67
(1) Every five years, review technology or treatment	68
techniques for mold identification and remediation that provide	69
additional protections to public health and safety. The review	70
shall be performed in accordance with rules adopted under this	71
section and include an examination of any new scientific	72
evidence that indicates that mold may present a greater health	73
risk to the public than previously determined.	7 4

(2) Establish a public awareness campaign on the dangers	75
of mold in accordance with rules adopted under this section. As	76
part of the campaign, the director shall disseminate information	77
via brochures and the department of commerce's web site.	78
(C) The director shall adopt rules in accordance with	79
Chapter 119. of the Revised Code establishing all of the	80
<pre>following:</pre>	81
(1) Requirements and procedures for the review required	82
under division (B)(1) of this section;	83
(2) Requirements and procedures for the public awareness	84
campaign established under division (B)(2) of this section. The	85
rules shall ensure that the campaign educates the public on the	86
health effects of mold in damp and water-damaged buildings,	87
methods of identification and remediation of mold, and contact	88
information for organizations or government agencies that can	89
assist the public with their concerns.	90
(3) Any other procedures or requirements necessary to	91
implement and administer this section.	92
(D) Notwithstanding any provision of section 121.95 of the	93
Revised Code to the contrary, a regulatory restriction contained	94
in a rule adopted under division (C) of this section is not	95
subject to sections 121.95 to 121.953 of the Revised Code.	96
Section 2. That existing section 121.083 of the Revised	97
Code is hereby repealed.	98
Section 3. (A) As used in this section, "mold" has the	99
same meaning as in section 3723.30 of the Revised Code.	100
(B) The Department of Commerce shall study any adverse	101
effects to humans from exposure to mold in damp and water-	102

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damaged buildings. The Department shall consult with medical	103	
research institutions and organizations with expertise on the	104	
adverse health effects from exposure to mold.	105	
(C) Not later than one year after the effective date of	106	
this section, the Department shall submit its findings to the	107	
General Assembly.	108
