A BILL

To enact section 3301.85 of the Revised Code to	1
establish the Regional Partnerships Program and	2
to make an appropriation.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3301.85 of the Revised Code be	4
enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 3301.85. (A) The department of education and	6
workforce, in conjunction with the department of higher	7
education, shall create, administer, and oversee the prenatal-	8
to-five early childhood to post-secondary regional partnerships	9
program to support existing and establish new early childhood to	10
post-secondary regional partnerships throughout Ohio in regions	11
that choose to participate. Each partnership may consist of	12
prenatal-to-five early learning programs, primary and secondary	13
schools, educational service centers, out-of-school time	14
providers, post-secondary institutions, and workforce and	15
community partners that are located in the same region and that	16
are working collaboratively to increase educational attainment	17
and economic mobility outcomes for children and adults.	18

(B) The departments shall do both of the following:	19
(1) Coordinate and convene a cohort of all existing and	20
emerging regional partnerships at least quarterly to share best	21
practices and assist in organizational development and growth;	22
(2) Distribute grants, in a manner determined by the	23
departments, to qualifying partnerships to support regional	24
collaboration programs that align educational resources and	25
community support with regional in-demand workforce skills,	26
opportunities, and jobs;	27
(3) Work to ensure that at least one regional partnership	28
exists within each of the six different regions of the state, as	29
determined by JobsOhio, as defined in section 187.01 of the	30
Revised Code;	31
(4) Report the progress and outcomes of each regional	32
partnership at least twice a year to the director of education	33
and workforce and the chancellor of higher education, and	34
annually to the governor and the general assembly.	35
(C)(1) Qualifying partnerships eligible to apply for	36
grants under this section shall demonstrate all of the	37
following:	38
(a) An identified theory of action and explicit commitment	39
to address all areas of the education and workforce continuum	40
over time, including a commitment to measure and report targeted	41
<u>attainment outcome metrics;</u>	42
(b) How it will integrate and align its work with business	43
advisory councils created under section 3313.82 of the Revised	44
Code within the region, the educational regional service system	45
established under Chapter 3312. of the Revised Code, industry	46

sector partnerships, and other regional educational attainment 47

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efforts as appropriate; 48 (c) How it will work with local health care systems, 49 service providers, and other stakeholders to better address the 50 workforce readiness, mental health, and well-being skills 51 children and young adults need to be successful in and beyond 52 elementary and secondary school years. 53 (2) Qualifying partnerships shall report all of the 54 following performance metrics for their region to the department 55 of education and workforce and the department of higher 56 education: 57 58 (a) Kindergarten readiness; (b) Third-grade reading proficiency; 59 (c) Middle grade math proficiency; 60 (d) High school graduation rates; 61 (e) Free application for federal student aid completion 62 63 rates; (f) Post-secondary enrollment; 64 (q) Post-secondary credential or degree completion; 65 (h) Employment for their region that includes the 66 following: 67 (i) Percentage of recent graduates who found employment 68 within one year of completing a post-secondary credential or 69 70 degree; 71 (ii) Percentage of recent graduates who completed some form of work-based learning while enrolled in a post-secondary 72 73 institution.

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(D) Beginning January 1, 2025, the director and department	74
of children and youth shall participate in the administration of	75
prenatal-to-five early childhood to post-secondary regional	76
partnerships program and the distribution of grants under this	77
section in conjunction with the departments of education and	78
workforce and higher education.	79

Section 2. All items in this act are hereby appropriated 80 as designated out of any moneys in the state treasury to the 81 credit of the designated fund. For all operating appropriations 82 made in this act, those in the first column are for fiscal year 83 2024 and those in the second column are for fiscal year 2025. 84 The operating appropriations made in this act are in addition to 85 any other operating appropriations made for these fiscal years. 86

The foregoing appropriation item 200545, Career-Technical

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Education Enhancements, shall be used to support the Prenatal- 91 to-Five Early Childhood to Post-secondary Regional Partnerships 92 Program created in section 3301.85 of the Revised Code. 93

An amount equal to the unexpended, unencumbered balance of 94 the foregoing appropriation item 200545, Career-Technical 95 Education Enhancements, at the end of fiscal year 2024 is hereby 96 reappropriated for the same purpose in fiscal year 2025. 97

Section 4. Within the limits set forth in this act, the 98 Director of Budget and Management shall establish accounts 99 indicating the source and amount of funds for each appropriation 100 made in this act, and shall determine the manner in which 101 appropriation accounts shall be maintained. Expenditures from 102 operating appropriations contained in this act shall be 103 accounted for as though made in, and are subject to all 104 applicable provisions of, H.B. 33 of the 135th General Assembly. 105

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
