A BILL

To amend section 3727.18; to amend, for the purpose	1
of adopting a new section number as indicated in	2
parentheses, section 3727.18 (3727.182); and to	3
enact new section 3727.18 and sections 109.7411,	4
3333.96, and 3727.181 of the Revised Code	5
regarding hospital violence prevention and	6
related training, security plans, and incident	7
reporting.	8

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3727.18 be amended; section	9
3727.18 (3727.182) be amended for the purpose of adopting a new	10
section number as indicated in parentheses; and new section	11
3727.18 and sections 109.7411, 3333.96, and 3727.181 of the	12
Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	13
Sec. 109.7411. The attorney general shall adopt, in	14
accordance with Chapter 119. or pursuant to section 109.74 of	15
the Revised Code, rules permitting security personnel employed	16
directly by a hospital system, or a hospital that is not part of	17
a hospital system, access to any online training that meets the	18
requirements of division (B)(4) of section 3727.18 of the	19

Revised Code and is available under sections 109.741 to 109.7410 20 of the Revised Code, or otherwise provided by the Ohio peace 21 officer training academy or at approved peace officer training 22 schools other than the Ohio peace officer training academy. 23 Sec. 3333.96. The department of higher education, jointly_ 24 with the department of health, shall survey colleges and 25 universities that provide education and training to students 26 seeking to become health care providers, including medical 27 students, nursing students, and allied health students, to 28 29 determine the extent to which the education and training provided to those students address the prevention of workplace 30 violence and management of aggressive behaviors. The survey 31 shall include a determination of whether de-escalation, conflict 32 management, and risk identification and assessment are part of 33 the education and training. 34 Based on the survey, the chancellor of higher education 35 shall make recommendations and prepare a report for the general 36 assembly. The report shall be provided in accordance with 37 section 101.68 of the Revised Code. 38 Sec. 3727.18. (A) Each hospital system, and each hospital 39 that is not part of a hospital system, shall establish a 40 security plan for preventing workplace violence and managing 41 aggressive behaviors. In developing the plan, the hospital 42 system or hospital shall involve a team that includes its health 43 care employees who provide direct patient care. 44 (B) All of the following apply to a security plan 45 established under this section: 46 (1) The plan shall be based on the results of a security 47 risk assessment, which, in the case of a hospital system, shall 48

(5) The plan shall include guidelines, developed jointly	86
with local law enforcement authorities, outlining when law	87
enforcement officers remain with a patient who has demonstrated	88
violence or poses a risk of self-harm or harm to others.	89
(C) Each hospital system and hospital that establishes a	90
security plan pursuant to this section shall review and evaluate	91
the plan on an annual basis. In conducting the review and	92
evaluation, the hospital system or hospital shall involve the	93
team that includes health care employees who are involved in	94
developing the security plan under this section. If it is	95
determined from the review and evaluation that revisions to the	96
plan are required, the hospital system or hospital shall revise	97
the plan accordingly.	98
(D) As part of licensure under Chapter 3722. of the	99
Revised Code, all hospital systems and hospitals shall submit to	100
the department of health, in a manner designated by the	101
department, verification of compliance with both of the	102
following:	103
(1) Sections 3727.18 to 3727.182 of the Revised Code;	104
(2) Any related requirements that are required as part of	105

the accreditation process of the hospital system's or hospital's	106
accrediting agency.	107
(E) Notwithstanding any provision of the Revised Code to	108
the contrary, both of the following are confidential and not	109
public records under section 149.43 of the Revised Code:	110
(1) Security plans developed under this section and their	111
annual revisions;	112
(2) Information submitted to the department under division	113

(F) The director of health may adopt rules as necessary to	115
implement this section and section 3727.181 of the Revised Code.	116
Any rules shall be adopted under Chapter 119. of the Revised	117

Notwithstanding any provision of section 121.95 of the	119
Revised Code to the contrary, a regulatory restriction contained	120
in a rule adopted under this section is not subject to sections	121
<u>121.95 to 121.953 of the Revised Code.</u>	122
Sec. 3727.181. Each hospital system, and each hospital	123
that is not part of a hospital system, shall establish a	124
workplace violence incident reporting system, which shall be	125
documented, tracked, and analyzed. The results of the analysis	126
shall be used to make improvements in preventing workplace	127
violence and managing aggressive behaviors, including	128
improvements achieved through continuing education in targeted	129
areas such as de-escalation training, risk identification, and	130
prevention planning.	131
The reporting system shall be clearly communicated to	132
employees and shall include guidelines for when and how to	133
report incidents to the employer, security agencies, law	134

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enforcement authorities, local emergency service organizations,	135
or government agencies.	136
Each hospital system, and each hospital that is not part	137
of a hospital system, shall adopt a policy that prohibits any	138
person from discriminating or retaliating against any health	139
care employee for reporting to, or seeking assistance or	140
intervention from, the employer, security agencies, law	141
enforcement authorities, local emergency service organizations,	142
or government agencies, or for participating in an incident	143
investigation.	144
All hospital systems and hospitals shall use their	145
reporting systems to track the following: the number of	146
incidents reported through their respective reporting systems;	147
the number of incidents reported to law enforcement authorities,	148
including those reported to a hospital police department; and	149
the number of individuals involved in the incidents who are	150
criminally charged as a result. The data shall be shared with	151
the team that includes health care employees who are involved in	152
developing the security plan under section 3727.18 of the	153
Revised Code.	154

<u>shall post the notice described in division (B) of this section</u>	156
in accordance with this division. A Each hospital that decides	157
to post the notice shall consider posting it the notice in a	158
conspicuous location in all of the following areas:	159
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(1) Major waiting room areas, including the waiting room	160
areas of the emergency department, the labor and delivery	161

areas of the emergency department, the labor and delivery 161 department, the surgical department or unit, and the intensive 162 care unit; 163

Section 2. That existing section 3727.18 of the Revised	178
Code is hereby repealed.	179
Section 3. In the case of a hospital system, or a hospital	180
that is not part of a hospital system, that exists on the	181
effective date of this section, the hospital system or hospital	182
shall do both of the following not later than three months after	183
that date:	184
(A) Comply with section 3727.18 of the Revised Code by	185
establishing a security plan for preventing workplace violence	186
and managing aggressive behaviors and by submitting a copy of	187
the plan to the Department of Health;	188
(B) Comply with section 3727.181 of the Revised Code by	189

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
