A BILL

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section	1
4503.536 of the Revised Code to create the "Save	2
a Warrior" license plate.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.536 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	8
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	9
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	10
in division (B) of this section.	11
(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	12
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	13
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	14
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast	15
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	16
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	17
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to	18
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of	19

the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20 other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40 directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar42receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the43national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money44it receives under this section to assist those who have45pancreatic cancer and their families.46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar47receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the48

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Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the49contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social50support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar52receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the53St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for54its research and other programs.55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56 receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 57 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 58 for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar60receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the61children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the62contributions for its research and other programs.63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar64receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to65the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to66raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic67pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 75 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76 contributions into its general account to be used for 77

educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of America foundation. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay

the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 85 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87 scholarships and other educational activities. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92 that organization. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94 receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95 Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96 scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 97 events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received99pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio100aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to101facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational102programming.103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received104pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the105organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that106

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organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 107 need.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 109 receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 110 kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 111 Ohio chapters of a kid again. 112

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 113 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 114 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 115 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 116 section. A university or college that receives contributions 117 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 118 scholarship fund. 119

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 120 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 121 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 122 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 123 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 124 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 125 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 126 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 127 funds as provided in this section. 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129 receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 130 Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 131 of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 132 attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 133 funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 134 program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 135 with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 136

funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 138 receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 139 university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 140 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 141 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 142 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 143 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 144 university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 145 146 funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar147receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the148Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the149contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign.150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen advocates for addiction recovery).

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 156 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 157 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 158 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 159 cyclists of all ages. 160

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar161receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the162"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial,163incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws164of this state, to assist that organization in paying the165

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expenses it i	ncurs in sponsorin	g or holding	g charitable, 16	6

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar168receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the169fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for170the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the171lighthouses of fairport harbor.172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar173receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the174Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the175contributions only to promote and support the football team of176Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 178 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 179 United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 180 distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 181 States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 182 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 183 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 184 sponsors within this state. 185

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 186 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 187 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 188 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 189 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 190 activities. 191

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar192receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the193Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives194

under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 195
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 196
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 197

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 198 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 199 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 200 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 201 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 202 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 203 204 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 205 the improvement of patient outcomes. 206

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 207 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 208 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 209 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 210 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 211 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 212 personnel, veterans, and their families. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214 receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 215 Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 216 the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 217

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 218 receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 219 nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 220 health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 221 further the nonprofit's mission. 222

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 224 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 225 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 226 families. 227

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.536 of the Revised Code to save a warrior, incorporated, which shall use the contributions to prevent suicide by active members of the armed forces of the United States, veterans of those armed forces, and first responders.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the247contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section2484503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other249source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is250designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The251Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this252section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and253

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cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 254 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 255 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 256 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 257

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 258 receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 259 rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 260

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 261 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 262 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 263 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 264 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 265 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 266 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 267 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 268 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 269 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 270 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 271 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 272 under this section. 273

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 274 receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 275 Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 276 the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 279 receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 280 western reserve historical society, which shall use the 281 contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 282

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar283receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the284Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple285negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the286contributions for charitable and educational purposes.287

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 288 receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 289 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 290 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 291 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 292 the person who paid the contribution resides. 293

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 294 receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to 295 playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use 296 the contributions to further its mission of presenting and 297 producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing 298 arts education, and creating a superior destination for 299 entertainment, business, and residential living. 300

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 301 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 302 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 303 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 304 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 305 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 306 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 307 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 308 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 309 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 310 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 311 such payments are to be made. 312

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 313 receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 314 Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 315 expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 316 river watershed. 317

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 318 receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 319 Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 320 nature preserve. 321

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar326receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the327Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the328contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.329

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar330receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the331girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the332contributions to support the activities of the organization.333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334 receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the 335 Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use 336 the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and 337 rehabilitation, and educational programs. 338

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar339receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the340Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those341

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contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational342information about beekeeping, and to support other state and343local beekeeping programs.344

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar345receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the346national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the347contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace348legends to inspire future leaders.349

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 350 receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 351 keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 352 contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 353 to take greater responsibility for improving the local 354 environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 355 greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 356

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use the contributions for educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 361 receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 362 Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 363 contributions to support the activities of the organization. 364

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 365 receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 366 progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 367 shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 368 center. 369

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 370

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receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the 371 American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the 372 contributions to support the activities of the organization. 373

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 374 receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the 375 Ohio natural energy institute to fund scholarships for students 376 pursuing careers in the oil and natural gas industry. 377

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 378 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 379 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 380 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 381 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 382 commission and that is participating in the license plate 383 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 384 of the county of residence of an applicant. 385

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 386 contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 387 the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 388 that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 389 participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 390 (G) of that section. 391

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 392 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 393 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 394 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 395 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 396 Ohio and for educational programs. 397

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar398receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to399

pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of

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supporting cancer research. 401 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 402 receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 403 Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 404 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 405 receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 406 407 Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 408 receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 409 410 Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 411 pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 412 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 413 receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 414 Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 415 shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 416 throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 417 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 418 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 419 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 420 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 421 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 422 423 scouts. 424 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 425 Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 426 shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 427

throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 428

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 429 receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 430 charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 431 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar433receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the434Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,435which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.436

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 437 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 438 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 439 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 440 charitable purposes. 441

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state moose association.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 445 receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the 446 Antioch shrine foundation located in the municipal corporation 447 of Dayton. 448

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar449receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the450fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall451deposit the fees into its general account to be used for452purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.453

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar454receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the455fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall456deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be457

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used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law458enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement459methods, and teaching respect for law and order.460

The registrar shall pay the contributions received461pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio462concerns of police survivors, which shall use those463contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate464to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed465in the line of duty.466

The registrar shall pay the contributions received467pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater468Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those469contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in470the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.471

The registrar shall pay the contributions received472pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio473association of chiefs of police.474

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 475 receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.715 of the 476 Revised Code to the community foundation of Ohio's electric 477 cooperatives, which shall use the contributions to recognize and 478 memorialize fallen or injured lineworkers and support their 479 families. 480

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar481receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the482fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall483use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.484

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar485receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the486

organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 487 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 488 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 489 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 490 administering a program to secure the proper representation in 491 the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 492 children, and for the training and supervision of persons 493 participating in that program. 494

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and advocacy purposes throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 504 receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 505 ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 506 split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 507 association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 508 agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 509 be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 510 advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 511 lives to the fullest. 512

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar513receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to514Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the515contributions into its general account to be used for purposes516

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of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in Cleveland, Ohio.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1062 receives pursuant to section 4503.953 of the Revised Code to 1063 Gilmour academy located in the municipal corporation of Gates 1064 Mills. The school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions 1065 it receives to provide tuition assistance to its students. The 1066 school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the 1067 expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 1068 students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 1069 emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 1070 include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 1071 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 1072 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 1073 abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1074 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1075 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 1076 services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 1077 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 1078 charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 1079 services. The school shall 1112 use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs 1113 in providing services to the school's students that assist in 1114 developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of 1115 the students. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1141 receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1142 Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1143 Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1144 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1145 students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1146 arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1147 the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1148

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1149

receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1150 Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1151 corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1152 contributions for any political purpose. 1153 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1154 receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1155 Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1156 Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1157 any political purpose. 1158 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1159 receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1160 Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1161 high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1162 purpose. 1163 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1164 receives pursuant to section 4503.964 of the Revised Code to 1165 Chardon hilltopper gridiron club. The club shall use 1166

contributions to fund college and career technical training 1167 scholarships for students. 1168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1169receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the1170friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money1171to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free1172emergency medical first response throughout Israel.1173

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1174 receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1175 Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1176 activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1177 city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1178

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1179 contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1180 the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1181 distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1182 section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1183 calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1184 entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1185 received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1186

Sec. 4503.536. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1187 car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1188 vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1189 may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1190 and issuance of "Save a Warrior" license plates. The application 1191 may be combined with a request for a special reserved license 1192 plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon 1193 receipt of the completed application and compliance by the 1194 applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the 1195 registrar shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle 1196 registration and a set of "Save a Warrior" license plates and a 1197 validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required 1198 by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 1199

"Save a Warrior" license plates shall display 1205 county identification stickers that identify the county of 1206 registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised 1207 1208 Code.
