A BILL

To amend sections 3302.03, 3365.03, 3365.04,	1
3365.05, 3365.11, and 3365.15 and to enact	2
section 3365.14 of the Revised Code regarding	3
the College Credit Plus Program.	4

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3302.03, 3365.03, 3365.04,	5	
3365.05, 3365.11, and 3365.15 be amended and section 3365.14 of	6	
the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	7	
Sec. 3302.03. Not later than the thirty-first day of July	8	
of each year, the department of education and workforce shall	9	
submit preliminary report card data for overall academic		
performance and for each separate performance measure for each		
school district, and each school building, in accordance with		
this section.		
Annually, not later than the fifteenth day of September or	14	
the preceding Friday when that day falls on a Saturday or	15	
Sunday, the department shall assign a letter grade or	16	
performance rating for overall academic performance and for each	17	
separate performance measure for each school district, and each	18	

school building in a district, in accordance with this section. 19 The department shall adopt rules pursuant to Chapter 119. of the 20 Revised Code to implement this section. The department's rules 21 shall establish performance criteria for each letter grade or 22 performance rating and prescribe a method by which the 23 department assigns each letter grade or performance rating. For 24 a school building to which any of the performance measures do 25 not apply, due to grade levels served by the building, the 26 department shall designate the performance measures that are 27 applicable to the building and that must be calculated 28 separately and used to calculate the building's overall grade or 29 performance rating. The department shall issue annual report 30 cards reflecting the performance of each school district, each 31 building within each district, and for the state as a whole 32 using the performance measures and letter grade or performance 33 rating system described in this section. The department shall 34 include on the report card for each district and each building 35 within each district the most recent two-year trend data in 36 student achievement for each subject and each grade. 37

(A) (1) For the 2012-2013 school year, the department shall
issue grades as described in division (F) of this section for
each of the following performance measures:

(a) Annual measurable objectives;

(b) Performance index score for a school district or
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building. Grades shall be awarded as a percentage of the total
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possible points on the performance index system as adopted by
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the department. In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter
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grades under division (A) (1) (b) of this section, the department
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shall designate ninety per cent or higher for an "A," at least
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seventy per cent but not more than eighty per cent for a "C,"

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and less than fifty per cent for an "F."

(c) The extent to which the school district or building 50 meets each of the applicable performance indicators established 51 by the department under section 3302.02 of the Revised Code and 52 the percentage of applicable performance indicators that have 53 been achieved. In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter 54 grades under division (A) (1) (c) of this section, the department 55 shall designate ninety per cent or higher for an "A." 56

(d) The four- and five-year adjusted cohort graduation rates.

In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter grades under 59 division (A)(1)(d), (B)(1)(d), or (C)(1)(d) of this section, the 60 department shall designate a four-year adjusted cohort 61 graduation rate of ninety-three per cent or higher for an "A" 62 and a five-year cohort graduation rate of ninety-five per cent 63 or higher for an "A." 64

(e) The overall score under the value-added progress
dimension of a school district or building, for which the
department shall use up to three years of value-added data as
available. The letter grade assigned for this growth measure
shall be as follows:

(i) A score that is at least one standard error of measureabove the mean score shall be designated as an "A."71

(ii) A score that is less than one standard error of
measure above but greater than one standard error of measure
below the mean score shall be designated as a "B."

(iii) A score that is less than or equal to one standard
error of measure below the mean score but greater than two
standard errors of measure below the mean score shall be
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78 designated as a "C." (iv) A score that is less than or equal to two standard 79 errors of measure below the mean score but is greater than three 80 standard errors of measure below the mean score shall be 81 designated as a "D." 82 (v) A score that is less than or equal to three standard 83 errors of measure below the mean score shall be designated as an 84 "F." 85 Whenever the value-added progress dimension is used as a 86 graded performance measure in this division and divisions (B) 87 and (C) of this section, whether as an overall measure or as a 88 measure of separate subgroups, the grades for the measure shall 89 90 be calculated in the same manner as prescribed in division (A) (1) (e) of this section. 91 (f) The value-added progress dimension score for a school 92 district or building disaggregated for each of the following 93

subgroups: students identified as gifted, students with94disabilities, and students whose performance places them in the95lowest quintile for achievement on a statewide basis. Each96subgroup shall be a separate graded measure.97

(2) The department shall adopt a resolution describing the
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performance measures, benchmarks, and grading system for the
2012-2013 school year and shall adopt rules in accordance with
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Chapter 119. of the Revised Code that prescribe the methods by
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which the performance measures under division (A) (1) of this
section shall be assessed and assigned a letter grade, including
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performance benchmarks for each letter grade.

At least forty-five days prior to the department's105adoption of rules to prescribe the methods by which the106

performance measures under division (A) (1) of this section shall107be assessed and assigned a letter grade, the department shall108conduct a public presentation before the standing committees of109the house of representatives and the senate that consider110education legislation describing such methods, including111performance benchmarks.112

(3) There shall not be an overall letter grade for aschool district or building for the 2012-2013 school year.

(B) (1) For the 2013-2014 school year, the department shall
issue grades as described in division (F) of this section for
each of the following performance measures:

(a) Annual measurable objectives;

(b) Performance index score for a school district or 119 building. Grades shall be awarded as a percentage of the total 120 possible points on the performance index system as created by 121 the department. In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter 122 grades under division (B)(1)(b) of this section, the department 123 shall designate ninety per cent or higher for an "A," at least 124 seventy per cent but not more than eighty per cent for a "C," 125 and less than fifty per cent for an "F." 126

(c) The extent to which the school district or building 127 meets each of the applicable performance indicators established 128 by the department under section 3302.03 of the Revised Code and 129 the percentage of applicable performance indicators that have 130 been achieved. In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter 131 grades under division (B)(1)(c) of this section, the department 132 shall designate ninety per cent or higher for an "A." 133

(d) The four- and five-year adjusted cohort graduation134rates;135

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(e) The overall score under the value-added progress
dimension of a school district or building, for which the
department shall use up to three years of value-added data as
available.

(f) The value-added progress dimension score for a school 140 district or building disaggregated for each of the following 141 subgroups: students identified as gifted in superior cognitive 142 ability and specific academic ability fields under Chapter 3324. 143 of the Revised Code, students with disabilities, and students 144 145 whose performance places them in the lowest quintile for achievement on a statewide basis. Each subgroup shall be a 146 separate graded measure. 147

(g) Whether a school district or building is making 148 progress in improving literacy in grades kindergarten through 149 three, as determined using a method prescribed by the 150 department. The department shall adopt rules to prescribe 151 benchmarks and standards for assigning grades to districts and 152 buildings for purposes of division (B)(1)(g) of this section. In 153 adopting benchmarks for assigning letter grades under divisions 154 (B) (1) (g) and (C) (1) (g) of this section, the department shall 155 determine progress made based on the reduction in the total 156 percentage of students scoring below grade level, or below 157 proficient, compared from year to year on the reading and 158 writing diagnostic assessments administered under section 159 3301.0715 of the Revised Code and the third grade English 160 language arts assessment under section 3301.0710 of the Revised 161 Code, as applicable. The department shall designate for a "C" 162 grade a value that is not lower than the statewide average value 163 for this measure. No grade shall be issued under divisions (B) 164 (1) (q) and (C) (1) (q) of this section for a district or building 165 in which less than five per cent of students have scored below 166

grade level on the diagnostic assessment administered to 167 students in kindergarten under division (B)(1) of section 168 3313.608 of the Revised Code. 169

(h) For a high mobility school district or building, an 170 additional value-added progress dimension score. For this 171 measure, the department shall use value-added data from the most 172 recent school year available and shall use assessment scores for 173 only those students to whom the district or building has 174 administered the assessments prescribed by section 3301.0710 of 175 the Revised Code for each of the two most recent consecutive 176 school years. 177

As used in this division, "high mobility school district or building" means a school district or building where at least twenty-five per cent of its total enrollment is made up of students who have attended that school district or building for less than one year.

(2) In addition to the graded measures in division (B)(1) 183 of this section, the department shall include on a school 184 district's or building's report card all of the following without an assigned letter grade: 186

(a) The percentage of students enrolled in a district or 187 building participating in advanced placement classes and the 188 percentage of those students who received a score of three or 189 better on advanced placement examinations; 190

(b) The number of a district's or building's students who 191 have earned at least three college credits through dual 192 enrollment or advanced standing programs, such as the post-193 secondary enrollment options program under Chapter 3365. of the 194 Revised Code and state-approved career-technical courses offered 195

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through dual enrollment or statewide articulation, that appear 196 on a student's transcript or other official document, either of 197 which is issued by the institution of higher education from 198 which the student earned the college credit. The credits earned 199 that are reported under divisions (B)(2)(b) and (C)(2)(c) of 200 this section shall not include any that are remedial or 201 developmental and shall include those that count toward the 202 203 curriculum requirements established for completion of a degree.

(c) The percentage of students enrolled in a district or 204 building who have taken a national standardized test used for 205 college admission determinations and the percentage of those 206 students who are determined to be remediation-free in accordance 207 with standards adopted under division (F) of section 3345.061 of 208 the Revised Code; 209

(d) The percentage of the district's or the building's students who receive industry-recognized credentials as approved under section 3313.6113 of the Revised Code.

(e) The percentage of students enrolled in a district or
building who are participating in an international baccalaureate
program and the percentage of those students who receive a score
of four or better on the international baccalaureate
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examinations.

(f) The percentage of the district's or building's
students who receive an honors diploma under division (B) of
section 3313.61 of the Revised Code.
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(3) The department shall adopt rules in accordance with
Chapter 119. of the Revised Code that prescribe the methods by
which the performance measures under divisions (B) (1) (f) and (B)
(1) (g) of this section will be assessed and assigned a letter
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grade, including performance benchmarks for each grade. 225 At least forty-five days prior to the department's 226 adoption of rules to prescribe the methods by which the 227 performance measures under division (B)(1) of this section shall 228 be assessed and assigned a letter grade, the department shall 229 conduct a public presentation before the standing committees of 230 the house of representatives and the senate that consider 231 education legislation describing such methods, including 232 performance benchmarks. 233 (4) There shall not be an overall letter grade for a 234 school district or building for the 2013-2014, 2014-2015, 2015-235 2016, and 2016-2017 school years. 236 (C) (1) For the 2014-2015, 2015-2016, 2016-2017, 2017-2018, 237 2018-2019, 2019-2020, and 2020-2021 school years, the department 238 shall issue grades as described in division (F) of this section 239 240 for each of the performance measures prescribed in division (C) (1) of this section. The graded measures are as follows: 241 (a) Annual measurable objectives. For the 2017-2018 school 242 year, the department shall not include any subgroup data in the 243 244 annual measurable objectives that includes data from fewer than twenty-five students. For the 2018-2019 school year, the 245 246 department shall not include any subgroup data in the annual measurable objectives that includes data from fewer than twenty 247 students. Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, the 248 department shall not include any subgroup data in the annual 249 measurable objectives that includes data from fewer than fifteen 250 students. 251 (b) Performance index score for a school district or 252 building. Grades shall be awarded as a percentage of the total 253

possible points on the performance index system as created by254the department. In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter255grades under division (C) (1) (b) of this section, the department256shall designate ninety per cent or higher for an "A," at least257seventy per cent but not more than eighty per cent for a "C,"258and less than fifty per cent for an "F."259

(c) The extent to which the school district or building 260 meets each of the applicable performance indicators established 261 by the department under section 3302.03 of the Revised Code and 262 the percentage of applicable performance indicators that have 263 been achieved. In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter 264 grades under division (C) (1) (c) of this section, the department 265 shall designate ninety per cent or higher for an "A." 266

(d) The four- and five-year adjusted cohort graduation rates;

(e) The overall score under the value-added progress
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dimension, or another measure of student academic progress if
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adopted by the department, of a school district or building, for
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which the department shall use up to three years of value-added
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data as available.

In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter grades for 274 overall score on value-added progress dimension under division 275 (C)(1)(e) of this section, the department shall prohibit the 276 assigning of a grade of "A" for that measure unless the 277 district's or building's grade assigned for value-added progress 278 dimension for all subgroups under division (C)(1)(f) of this 279 section is a "C" or higher. 280

For the metric prescribed by division (C) (1) (e) of this281section, the department may adopt a student academic progress282

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measure to be used instead of the value-added progress283dimension. If the department adopts such a measure, it also284shall prescribe a method for assigning letter grades for the new285measure that is comparable to the method prescribed in division286(A) (1) (e) of this section.287

(f) The value-added progress dimension score of a school 288 district or building disaggregated for each of the following 289 subgroups: students identified as gifted in superior cognitive 290 ability and specific academic ability fields under Chapter 3324. 291 292 of the Revised Code, students with disabilities, and students 293 whose performance places them in the lowest quintile for achievement on a statewide basis, as determined by a method 294 prescribed by the department. Each subgroup shall be a separate 295 graded measure. 296

The department may adopt student academic progress measures to be used instead of the value-added progress dimension. If the department adopts such measures, it also shall prescribe a method for assigning letter grades for the new measures that is comparable to the method prescribed in division (A) (1) (e) of this section.

(g) Whether a school district or building is making 303 progress in improving literacy in grades kindergarten through 304 three, as determined using a method prescribed by the 305 department. The department shall adopt rules to prescribe 306 benchmarks and standards for assigning grades to a district or 307 building for purposes of division (C)(1)(g) of this section. The 308 department shall designate for a "C" grade a value that is not 309 lower than the statewide average value for this measure. No 310 grade shall be issued under division (C)(1)(g) of this section 311 for a district or building in which less than five per cent of 312

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students have scored below grade level on the kindergarten diagnostic assessment under division (B)(1) of section 3313.608 of the Revised Code.

(h) For a high mobility school district or building, an 316 additional value-added progress dimension score. For this 317 measure, the department shall use value-added data from the most 318 recent school year available and shall use assessment scores for 319 only those students to whom the district or building has 320 administered the assessments prescribed by section 3301.0710 of 321 the Revised Code for each of the two most recent consecutive 322 school years. 323

As used in this division, "high mobility school district or building" means a school district or building where at least twenty-five per cent of its total enrollment is made up of students who have attended that school district or building for less than one year.

(2) In addition to the graded measures in division (C)(1)
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of this section, the department shall include on a school
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district's or building's report card all of the following
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without an assigned letter grade:
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(a) The percentage of students enrolled in a district or
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building who have taken a national standardized test used for
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college admission determinations and the percentage of those
students who are determined to be remediation-free in accordance
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with the standards adopted under division (F) of section
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3345.061 of the Revised Code;

(b) The percentage of students enrolled in a district or
building participating in advanced placement classes and the
percentage of those students who received a score of three or
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better on advanced placement examinations;

(c) The percentage of a district's or building's students 343 who have earned at least three college credits through advanced 344 standing programs, such as the college credit plus program under 345 Chapter 3365. of the Revised Code and state-approved career-346 technical courses offered through dual enrollment or statewide 347 articulation, that appear on a student's college transcript 348 issued by the institution of higher education from which the 349 student earned the college credit. The credits earned that are 350 reported under divisions (B)(2)(b) and (C)(2)(c) of this section 351 shall not include any that are remedial or developmental and 352 shall include those that count toward the curriculum 353 354 requirements established for completion of a degree.

(d) The percentage of the district's or building's 355
students who receive an honor's diploma under division (B) of 356
section 3313.61 of the Revised Code; 357

(e) The percentage of the district's or building's 358
students who receive industry-recognized credentials as approved 359
under section 3313.6113 of the Revised Code; 360

(f) The percentage of students enrolled in a district or
building who are participating in an international baccalaureate
program and the percentage of those students who receive a score
of four or better on the international baccalaureate
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examinations;

(g) The results of the college and career-ready
assessments administered under division (B) (1) of section
3301.0712 of the Revised Code;
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(h) Whether the school district or building has369implemented a positive behavior intervention and supports370

framework in compliance with the requirements of section 3319.46	371
of the Revised Code, notated as a "yes" or "no" answer.	372
(3) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to Chapter	373
119. of the Revised Code that establish a method to assign an	374
overall grade for a school district or school building for the	375
2017-2018 school year and each school year thereafter. The rules	376
shall group the performance measures in divisions (C)(1) and (2)	377
of this section into the following components:	378
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(a) Gap closing, which shall include the performance	379
measure in division (C)(1)(a) of this section;	380
(b) Achievement, which shall include the performance	381
measures in divisions (C)(1)(b) and (c) of this section;	382
(c) Progress, which shall include the performance measures	383
in divisions (C)(1)(e) and (f) of this section;	384
(d) Graduation, which shall include the performance	385
measure in division (C)(1)(d) of this section;	386
(e) Kindergarten through third-grade literacy, which shall	387
include the performance measure in division (C)(1)(g) of this	388
section;	389
(f) Prepared for success, which shall include the	390
performance measures in divisions (C)(2)(a), (b), (c), (d), (e),	391
and (f) of this section. The department shall develop a method	392
to determine a grade for the component in division (C)(3)(f) of	393
this section using the performance measures in divisions (C)(2)	394
(a), (b), (c), (d), (e), and (f) of this section. When	395
available, the department may incorporate the performance	396
measure under division (C)(2)(g) of this section into the	397
component under division (C)(3)(f) of this section. When	398
determining the overall grade for the prepared for success	399
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component prescribed by division (C)(3)(f) of this section, no 400 individual student shall be counted in more than one performance 401 measure. However, if a student qualifies for more than one 402 performance measure in the component, the department may, in its 403 method to determine a grade for the component, specify an 404 additional weight for such a student that is not greater than or 405 equal to 1.0. In determining the overall score under division 406 (C) (3) (f) of this section, the department shall ensure that the 407 pool of students included in the performance measures aggregated 408 under that division are all of the students included in the 409 four- and five-year adjusted graduation cohort. 410

In the rules adopted under division (C)(3) of this 411 section, the department shall adopt a method for determining a 412 grade for each component in divisions (C)(3)(a) to (f) of this 413 section. The department also shall establish a method to assign 414 an overall grade of "A," "B," "C," "D," or "F" using the grades 415 assigned for each component. The method the department adopts 416 for assigning an overall grade shall give equal weight to the 417 components in divisions (C)(3)(b) and (c) of this section. 418

At least forty-five days prior to the department's 419 adoption of rules to prescribe the methods for calculating the 420 overall grade for the report card, as required by this division, 421 the department shall conduct a public presentation before the 422 standing committees of the house of representatives and the 423 senate that consider education legislation describing the format 424 for the report card, weights that will be assigned to the 425 components of the overall grade, and the method for calculating 426 the overall grade. 427

(D) For the 2021-2022 school year and each school year428thereafter, all of the following apply:429

(1) The department shall include on a school district's or
building's report card all of the following performance measures
without an assigned performance rating:
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(a) Whether the district or building meets the gifted
performance indicator under division (A) (2) of section 3302.02
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of the Revised Code and the extent to which the district or
building meets gifted indicator performance benchmarks;
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(b) The extent to which the district or building meets the
chronic absenteeism indicator under division (A) (3) of section
3302.02 of the Revised Code;
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(c) Performance index score percentage for a district or
building, which shall be calculated by dividing the district's
or building's performance index score according to the
performance index system created by the department by the
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maximum performance index score for a district or building. The
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maximum performance index score shall be as follows:

(i) For a building, the average of the highest two per
cent of performance index scores achieved by a building for the
school year for which a report card is issued;
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(ii) For a district, the average of the highest two per
cent of performance index scores achieved by a district for the
school year for which a report card is issued.

(d) The overall score under the value-added progress
dimension of a district or building, for which the department
shall use three consecutive years of value-added data. In using
three years of value-added data to calculate the measure
prescribed under division (D) (1) (d) of this section, the
department shall assign a weight of fifty per cent to the most
recent year's data and a weight of twenty-five per cent to the

data of each of the other years. However, if three consecutive459years of value-added data is not available, the department shall460use prior years of value-added data to calculate the measure, as461follows:462

(i) If two consecutive years of value-added data is not
available, the department shall use one year of value-added data
to calculate the measure.

(ii) If two consecutive years of value-added data is 466 available, the department shall use two consecutive years of 467 value-added data to calculate the measure. In using two years of 468 value-added data to calculate the measure, the department shall 469 assign a weight of sixty-seven per cent to the most recent 470 year's data and a weight of thirty-three per cent to the data of 471 the other year. 472

- (e) The four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate.
- (f) The five-year adjusted cohort graduation rate.

(g) The percentage of students in the district or building
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To the extent possible, the department shall include the479results of the summer administration of the third grade reading480assessment under section 3301.0710 of the Revised Code in the481performance measures prescribed under divisions (D) (1) (g) and482(h) of this section.483

(h) Whether a district or building is making progress in
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improving literacy in grades kindergarten through three, as
determined using a method prescribed by the department. The
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method shall determine progress made based on the reduction in
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the total percentage of students scoring below grade level, or 488 below proficient, compared from year to year on the reading 489 segments of the diagnostic assessments administered under 490 section 3301.0715 of the Revised Code, including the 491 kindergarten readiness assessment, and the third grade English 492 language arts assessment under section 3301.0710 of the Revised 493 Code, as applicable. The method shall not include a deduction 494 for students who did not pass the third grade English language 495 arts assessment under section 3301.0710 of the Revised Code and 496 were not on a reading improvement and monitoring plan. 497

The performance measure prescribed under division (D) (1)498(h) of this section shall not be included on the report card of499a district or building in which less than ten per cent of500students have scored below grade level on the diagnostic501assessment administered to students in kindergarten under502division (B) (1) of section 3313.608 of the Revised Code.503

(i) The percentage of students in a district or building
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who are promoted to the fourth grade and not subject to
retention under division (A) (2) of section 3313.608 of the
Revised Code;

(j) A post-secondary readiness measure. This measure shall 508 be calculated by dividing the number of students included in the 509 four-year adjusted graduation rate cohort who demonstrate post- 510 secondary readiness by the total number of students included in 511 the denominator of the four-year adjusted graduation rate 512 cohort. Demonstration of post-secondary readiness shall include 513 a student doing any of the following: 514

(i) Attaining a remediation-free score, in accordance with
 standards adopted under division (F) of section 3345.061 of the
 Revised Code, on a nationally standardized assessment prescribed
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under division (B)(1) of section 3301.0712 of the Revised Code;	518
(ii) Attaining required scores on three or more advanced	519
placement or international baccalaureate examinations. The	520
required score for an advanced placement examination shall be a	521
three or better. The required score for an international	522
baccalaureate examination shall be a four or better. A student	523
may satisfy this condition with any combination of advanced	524
placement or international baccalaureate examinations.	525
(iii) Earning at least twelve college credits through	526
advanced standing programs, such as the college credit plus	527
program under Chapter 3365. of the Revised Code, an early	528
college high school program under section 3313.6013 of the	529
Revised Code, and state-approved career-technical courses	530
offered through dual enrollment or statewide articulation, that	531
appear on a student's college transcript issued by the	532
institution of higher education from which the student earned	533
the college credit. Earned credits reported under division (D)	534
(1)(j)(iii) of this section shall include credits that count	535
toward the curriculum requirements established for completion of	536
a degree, but shall not include any remedial or developmental	537
credits.	538

(iv) Meeting the additional criteria for an honors diplomaunder division (B) of section 3313.61 of the Revised Code;540

(v) Earning an industry-recognized credential or license
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issued by a state agency or board for practice in a vocation
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that requires an examination for issuance of that license
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approved under section 3313.6113 of the Revised Code;
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(vi) Satisfying any of the following conditions: 545

(I) Completing a pre-apprenticeship aligned with options 546

established under section 3313.904 of the Revised Code in the	547
student's chosen career field;	548
(II) Completing an apprenticeship registered with the	549
apprenticeship council established under section 4139.02 of the	550
Revised Code in the student's chosen career field;	551
(III) Providing evidence of acceptance into an	552
apprenticeship program after high school that is restricted to	553
participants eighteen years of age or older.	554
(vii) Earning a cumulative score of proficient or higher	555
on three or more state technical assessments aligned with	556
section 3313.903 of the Revised Code in a single career pathway;	557
(viii) Earning an OhioMeansJobs-readiness seal established	558
under section 3313.6112 of the Revised Code and completing two	559
hundred fifty hours of an internship or other work-based	560
learning experience that is either:	561
(I) Approved by the business advisory council established	562
under section 3313.82 of the Revised Code that represents the	563
student's district; or	564

As used in this section, "English learner" has the same 1140 meaning as in section 3301.0731 of the Revised Code. 1141
