# A BILL

То	enact section 3301.85 of the Revised Code to	1
	establish the Regional Partnerships Program, to	2
	transfer cash from the General Revenue Fund to	3
	the State Board of Education Licensure Fund, and	4
	to make an appropriation.	5

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

<b>Section 1.</b> That section 3301.85 of the Revised Code be	6
enacted to read as follows:	7
Sec. 3301.85. (A) The department of education and	8
workforce, in conjunction with the department of higher	9
education, shall create, administer, and oversee the prenatal-	10
to-five early childhood to post-secondary regional partnerships	11
program to support existing and establish new early childhood to	12
post-secondary regional partnerships throughout Ohio in regions	13
that choose to participate. The department of education and	14
workforce is the agency primarily responsible for implementation	15

of the program. Each partnership may consist of prenatal-to-five	16
early learning programs, primary and secondary schools,	17
educational service centers, out-of-school time providers, post-	18
secondary institutions, and workforce and community partners	19
that are located in the same region and that are working	20
collaboratively to increase educational attainment and economic	21
mobility outcomes for children and adults.	22
(B) The departments shall do both of the following:	23
(1) Coordinate and convene a cohort of all existing and	24
emerging regional partnerships at least quarterly to share best	25
practices and assist in organizational development and growth;	26
(2) Distribute grants, in a manner determined by the	27
departments, to qualifying partnerships to support regional	28
collaboration programs that align educational resources and	29
community support with regional in-demand workforce skills,	30
opportunities, and jobs;	31
(3) Work to ensure that at least one regional partnership	32
exists within each of the six different regions of the state, as	33
determined by JobsOhio, as defined in section 187.01 of the	34
Revised Code;	35
(4) Report the progress and outcomes of each regional	36
partnership at least twice a year to the director of education	37
and workforce and the chancellor of higher education, and	38
annually to the governor and the general assembly.	39
(C) (1) Qualifying partnerships eligible to apply for	40
grants under this section shall demonstrate all of the	41

(a) An identified theory of action and explicit commitment	43
to address all areas of the education and workforce continuum	44

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over time, including a commitment to measure and report targeted	45
attainment outcome metrics;	
(b) How it will integrate and align its work with business	47
advisory councils created under section 3313.82 of the Revised	48
Code within the region, the educational regional service system	49
established under Chapter 3312. of the Revised Code, industry	50
