# BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3335.39 and 3364.07 of the	8

civics, culture, and society is established as an independent	11
unit within the Ohio state university, initially located in the	12
college of public affairs. The center shall conduct teaching and	13
research in the historical ideas, traditions, and texts that	14
have shaped the American constitutional order and society.	15
(2) The center shall establish bylaws requiring the center	16
to do all of the following:	17
(a) Educate students by means of free, open, and rigorous	18
intellectual inquiry to seek the truth;	19

Sec. 3364.07. (A) The institute of American constitutional	90
thought and leadership is established for the purpose of	91
creating and disseminating knowledge about American	92
constitutional thought and to form future leaders of the legal	93
profession through research, scholarship, teaching,	94

academic unit within the university of Toledo, initially located	96
at the college of law. The university shall require the college	97
of law to provide adequate administrative space for the	98

(4) The institute shall create a community dedicated to an134ethic of civil and free inquiry, which respects the intellectual135freedom of each member, supports individual capacities for136growth, and welcomes the differences of opinion that naturally137occur in a public university community.138

(D) (1) Not later than sixty days after the effective date139of this section, the talent, compensation, and governance140committee of the board of trustees of the university, if such a141committee exists, shall appoint, with the advice and consent of142the senate, a seven-member institute academic council. If no143such committee exists, the board of trustees shall appoint144members under this division.145

(2) The academic council shall be comprised of scholars146with relevant expertise and experience. Not more than one member147of the council may be an employee of the university. Not less148than three members of the council shall be from Ohio.149

(3) Three members of the academic council shall serve150initial terms of two years and four members shall serve initial151terms of four years, which the members shall determine at their152first meeting, and select replacements for vacant seats.153

(4) To fill a vacancy for the institute director,154following a national search, the academic council shall transmit155to the president a list of finalists from which the president156shall select a director, subject to the approval of the talent,157compensation, and governance committee of the board of trustees.158

(E)(1) The institute shall be led by a director who shall	159

of the university shall appoint an initial director not later	162
