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**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.541 of the Revised Code to create the 2  
"Dolly Parton's Imagination Library" license 3  
plate and to declare an emergency. 4

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 5  
4503.541 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 6

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 7  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 8  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 9  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 10  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 11  
in division (B) of this section. 12

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 13  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 14

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 15  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 16  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 17

programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 18  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 19  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 20  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 21  
other abortion-related activities. 22

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 23  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 24  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 25  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 26  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 27  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 28  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 29  
other money in that fund. 30

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 31  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 32  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 33  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 34

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 35  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 36  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 37  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 38  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 39  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 40  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 41  
directly to their clients. 42

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 43  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 44  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 45  
it receives under this section to assist those who have 46  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 47

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the

future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 77  
contributions into its general account to be used for 78  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 79  
America foundation. 80

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 81  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 82  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 83  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 84  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 85

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 86  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 87  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 88  
scholarships and other educational activities. 89

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 90  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 91  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 92  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 93  
that organization. 94

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 95  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 96  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 97  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 98  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 99

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 100  
pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 101  
aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 102  
facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 103  
programming. 104

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 105

pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 106  
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 107  
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 108  
need. 109

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 110  
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 111  
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 112  
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 113

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 114  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 115  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 116  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 117  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 118  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 119  
scholarship fund. 120

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 121  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 122  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 123  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 124  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 125  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 126  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 127  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 128  
funds as provided in this section. 129

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 130  
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 131  
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 132  
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 133  
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 134  
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 135

program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 136  
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 137  
funds as provided in this section. 138

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 139  
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 140  
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 141  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 142  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 143  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 144  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 145  
university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 146  
funds as provided in this section. 147

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 148  
receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 149  
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 150  
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 151

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 152  
receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code 153  
equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of 154  
Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen 155  
advocates for addiction recovery). 156

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 157  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 158  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 159  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 160  
cyclists of all ages. 161

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 162  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 163  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 164

incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 165  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 166  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 167  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 169  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 170  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 171  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 172  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 173

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 174  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 175  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 176  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 177  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 178

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 179  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 180  
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 181  
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 182  
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 183  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 184  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 185  
sponsors within this state. 186

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 187  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 188  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 189  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 190  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 191  
activities. 192

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 193

receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 194  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 195  
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 196  
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 197  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 198

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 199  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 200  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 201  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 202  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 203  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 204  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 205  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 206  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 207

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 208  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 209  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 210  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 211  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 212  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 213  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 214

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 215  
receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 216  
Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 217  
the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 218

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 219  
receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 220  
nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 221  
health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 222  
further the nonprofit's mission. 223



The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.541 of the Revised Code to Dolly Parton's imagination library of Ohio. The library shall use the money it receives under this section for operational costs, including the distribution of books.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and

cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 254  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 255  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 256  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 257

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 258  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 259  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 260

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 261  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 262  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 263  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 264  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 265  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 266  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 267  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 268  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 269  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 270  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 271  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 272  
under this section. 273

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 274  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 275  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 276  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 277  
programs. 278

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 279  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 280  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 281  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 282

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the contributions for charitable and educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use the contributions to further its mission of presenting and producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing arts education, and creating a superior destination for entertainment, business, and residential living.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which such payments are to be made.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and rehabilitation, and educational programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those

contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 342  
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 343  
local beekeeping programs. 344

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 345  
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 346  
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 347  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 348  
legends to inspire future leaders. 349

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 350  
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 351  
keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 352  
contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 353  
to take greater responsibility for improving the local 354  
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 355  
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 356

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 357  
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 358  
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 359  
the contributions for educational purposes. 360

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 361  
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 362  
Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 363  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 364

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 365  
receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 366  
progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 367  
shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 368  
center. 369

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 370

receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the 371  
American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the 372  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 373

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 374  
receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the 375  
Ohio natural energy institute to fund scholarships for students 376  
pursuing careers in the oil and natural gas industry. 377

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 378  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 379  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 380  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 381  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 382  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 383  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 384  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 385

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 386  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 387  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 388  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 389  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 390  
(G) of that section. 391

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 392  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 393  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 394  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 395  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 396  
Ohio and for educational programs. 397

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 398  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 399

pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 400  
supporting cancer research. 401

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 402  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 403  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 404

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 405  
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 406  
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 407

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 408  
receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 409  
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 410  
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 411  
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 412

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 413  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 414  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 415  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 416  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 417

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 418  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 419  
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 420  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 421  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 422  
scouts. 423

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 424  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 425  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 426  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 427  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 428

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 429  
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 430  
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 431  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 433  
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 434  
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 435  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 436

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 437  
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 438  
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 439  
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 440  
charitable purposes. 441

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 442  
receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the 443  
Ohio state moose association. 444

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 445  
receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the 446  
Antioch shrine foundation located in the municipal corporation 447  
of Dayton. 448

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 449  
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 450  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 451  
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 452  
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 453

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 454  
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 455  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 456  
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 457



used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 458  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 459  
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 460

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 461  
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 462  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 463  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 464  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 465  
in the line of duty. 466

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 467  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 468  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 469  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 470  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 471

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 472  
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 473  
association of chiefs of police. 474

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 475  
receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.715 of the 476  
Revised Code to the community foundation of Ohio's electric 477  
cooperatives, which shall use the contributions to recognize and 478  
memorialize fallen or injured lineworkers and support their 479  
families. 480

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 481  
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 482  
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 483  
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 484

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 485  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 486

organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 487  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 488  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 489  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 490  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 491  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 492  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 493  
participating in that program. 494

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 495  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 496  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 497  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 498

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 499  
receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 500

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.941 of the Revised Code to the Ohio chapter international society of arboriculture, which shall use the money to increase consumer awareness on the importance of proper tree care and to raise funds for the chapter's educational efforts. 1016  
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The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.942 of the Revised Code to zero, the end of prostate cancer, incorporated, a nonprofit organization, which shall use those contributions to raise awareness of prostate cancer, to support research to end prostate cancer, and to support prostate cancer patients and their families. 1022  
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.944 of the Revised Code to the eastern European congress of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for charitable and educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.945 of the Revised Code to the Summit metro parks foundation, which shall use the money in support of the Summit county metro parks.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.951 of the Revised Code to the Cincinnati city school district.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.952 of the Revised Code to Hawken school located in northeast Ohio. The school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of providing such services, the school may pay for members of the faculty of the school to receive training in providing those services. The school principal or, in the school principal's discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those services. receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1142  
Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1143  
Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1144  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1145  
students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1146  
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1147  
the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1148

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1149

receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1150  
Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1151  
corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1152  
contributions for any political purpose. 1153

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1154  
receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1155  
Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1156  
Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1157  
any political purpose. 1158

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1159  
receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1160  
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1161  
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1162  
purpose. 1163

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1164  
receives pursuant to section 4503.964 of the Revised Code to 1165  
Chardon hilltopper gridiron club. The club shall use 1166  
contributions to fund college and career technical training 1167  
scholarships for students. 1168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1169  
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1170  
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1171  
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1172  
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1173

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1174  
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1175  
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1176  
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1177  
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1178



(C) All investment earnings of the license plate contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this section the investment income the fund earned the previous calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity received from the fund during the previous calendar year.

Sec. 4503.541. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle and issuance of "Dolly Parton's Imagination Library" license plates. The application may be combined with a request for a special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Dolly Parton's Imagination Library" license plates and a validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code.

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily inscribed on the license plates, "Dolly Parton's Imagination Library" license plates shall display an appropriate logo and words that are selected by representatives of the Dolly Parton's imagination library and approved by the registrar.

(B) "Dolly Parton's Imagination Library" license plates and a validation sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon receipt of an application for registration of a

motor vehicle under this section; payment of the regular license 1209  
tax as prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1210  
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1211  
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1212  
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1213  
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 1214  
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with 1215  
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1216  
vehicles. 1217

(C)(1) For each application for registration and 1218  
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1219  
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of twenty- 1220  
five dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into 1221  
the state treasury to the credit of the license plate 1222  
contribution fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised 1223  
Code. 1224

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1225  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1226  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1227  
of "Dolly Parton's Imagination Library" license plates, into the 1228  
state treasury to the credit of the public safety - highway 1229  
purposes fund created in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1230

(D)(1) Section 4503.78 of the Revised Code does not apply 1231  
to license plates issued under this section. 1232

(2) County identification stickers are not required for 1233  
license plates issued under this section. 1234
