BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and sections	7
4503.541, 5533.106, 5534.013, 5534.427, 5534.429, 5534.443,	8
5534.482, 5534.505, 5534.617, 5534.673, 5534.8710, 5534.926, and	9
5534.966 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	10
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	11
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	12
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	13
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	14
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	15
in division (B) of this section.	16

(B)	The regis	strar sh	nall pay	the contributions	the	17
registrar	collects	in the	fund as	follows:		18

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 19 pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 20 cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 21 programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 22 cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 23 quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 24 the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 25 other abortion-related activities. 26

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 39 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 40 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 41 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 42 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 43 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 44 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 45 directly to their clients. 46

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 47 receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 48 national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 49 it receives under this section to assist those who have 50 pancreatic cancer and their families. 51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar65receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the66children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the67contributions for its research and other programs.68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar69receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to70the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to71raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic72pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar74receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to75

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the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide76children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund77research for the cure of childhood cancers.78

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 79 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 80 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 81 contributions into its general account to be used for 82 educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 83 America foundation. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for scholarships and other educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 94 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 95 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 96 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 97 that organization. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar99receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to100Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for101scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or102events the organization holds or sponsors in this state.103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 104

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pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio105aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to106facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational107programming.108

The registrar shall pay the contributions received109pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the110organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that111organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in112need.113

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 114 receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 115 kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 116 Ohio chapters of a kid again. 117

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the university or college whose name or marking or design appears on collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that section. A university or college that receives contributions from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general scholarship fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 125 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 126 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 127 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 128 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 129 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 130 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 131 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 132 funds as provided in this section. 133

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 134 receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 135 Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 136 of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 137 attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 1.38 funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 139 program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 140 with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 141 funds as provided in this section. 142

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 143 receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 144 university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 145 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 146 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 147 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 148 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 149 university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 150 funds as provided in this section. 151

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar152receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the153Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the154contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign.155

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 156 receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code 157 equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of 158 Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen 159 advocates for addiction recovery). 160

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar161receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the162Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying163

for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 164 cyclists of all ages. 165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 167 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 168 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 169 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 170 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 171 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar173receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the174fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for175the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the176lighthouses of fairport harbor.177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 178 receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 179 Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 180 contributions only to promote and support the football team of 181 Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 182

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 183 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 184 United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 185 distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 186 States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 187 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 188 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 189 sponsors within this state. 190

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar191receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the192

Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis193international, which shall use the money it receives under this194section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian195activities.196

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 197 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 198 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 199 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 200 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 201 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 202

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 203 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 204 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 205 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 206 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 207 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 208 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 209 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 210 the improvement of patient outcomes. 211

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 212 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 213 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 214 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 215 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 216 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 217 personnel, veterans, and their families. 218

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 219 receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 220 Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 221 the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 222

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 223 receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 224 nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 225 health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 226 further the nonprofit's mission. 227

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar233receives pursuant to section 4503.541 of the Revised Code to234Dolly Parton's imagination library of Ohio. The library shall235use the money it receives under this section for operational236costs, including the distribution of books.237

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 238 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 239 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 240 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 241 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 242 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 243 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 244 destination. 245

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 246 the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 247 to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 248 the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 249 programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 250

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the

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contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 252 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 253 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 254 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 255 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 256 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 2.57 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 258 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 259 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 260 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 261

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar262receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the263rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.264

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 265 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 266 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 267 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 268 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 269 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 270 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 271 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 272 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 273 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 274 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 275 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 276 under this section. 277

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar278receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the279Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use280the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and281

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programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar283receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the284western reserve historical society, which shall use the285contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.286

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar287receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the288Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple289negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the290contributions for charitable and educational purposes.291

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 292 receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 293 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 294 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 295 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 296 the person who paid the contribution resides. 297

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 298 receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to 299 playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use 300 the contributions to further its mission of presenting and 301 producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing 302 arts education, and creating a superior destination for 303 entertainment, business, and residential living. 304

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 305 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 306 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 307 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 308 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 309 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 310

ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively311for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and312managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of313Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the314registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which315such payments are to be made.316

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 317 receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 318 Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 319 expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 320 river watershed. 321

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar330receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the331Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the332contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar334receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the335girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the336contributions to support the activities of the organization.337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar338receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the339

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Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use340the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and341rehabilitation, and educational programs.342

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 343 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 344 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 345 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 346 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 347 local beekeeping programs. 348

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar349receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the350national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the351contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace352legends to inspire future leaders.353

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 354 receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 355 keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 356 contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 357 to take greater responsibility for improving the local 358 environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 359 greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 360

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 361 receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 362 national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 363 the contributions for educational purposes. 364

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 365 receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 366 Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 367 contributions to support the activities of the organization. 368

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 369 receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 370 progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 371 shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 372 center. 373

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 374 receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the 375 American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the 376 contributions to support the activities of the organization. 377

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar378receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the379Ohio natural energy institute to fund scholarships for students380pursuing careers in the oil and natural gas industry.381

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 382 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 383 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 384 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 385 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 386 commission and that is participating in the license plate 387 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 388 of the county of residence of an applicant. 389

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each390contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of391the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates392that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is393participating in the license plate program pursuant to division394(G) of that section.395

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar396receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to397

The registrar shall pay the contributions received465pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio466concerns of police survivors, which shall use those467contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate468to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed469in the line of duty.470

The registrar shall pay the contributions received471pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater472Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those473contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in474the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.475

The registrar shall pay the contributions received476pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio477association of chiefs of police.478

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 479 receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.715 of the 480 Revised Code to the community foundation of Ohio's electric 481 cooperatives, which shall use the contributions to recognize and 482 memorialize fallen or injured lineworkers and support their 483 families. 484

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 485 receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 486 fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 487 use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 488

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in administering a program to secure the proper representation in the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent children, and for the training and supervision of persons participating in that program.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 503 receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 504 Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and advocacy purposes throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 508 receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.725 of the 509 Revised Code to the ALS united Ohio, incorporated, which shall 510 split the contributions between that organization and the ALS 511 association in accordance with any agreement between the two 512 organizations. The contributions shall be used to discover 513 treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, advocate for, and 514
