S. B. No. 23 – Senator Lang

To amend section 9.48 of the Revised Code to expand political subdivision joint purchasing authority to expressly include purchases for construction services.

(Committee on Government Oversight recommends passage April 19, 2023)

To amend sections 128.01, 128.02, 128.021, 128.022, 128.03, 128.06, 128.07, 128.08, 128.12, 128.18, 128.22, 128.32, 128.34, 128.40, 128.42, 128.44, 128.45, 128.46, 128.461, 128.462, 128.47, 128.52, 128.54, 128.55, 128.57, 128.60, 128.63, 128.99, 149.43, 4776.20, 5703.052, 5733.55, and 5751.01; to amend, for the purpose of adopting new section numbers as indicated in parentheses, sections 128.18 (128.33), 128.22 (128.35), 128.32 (128.96), 128.34 (128.98), 128.40 (128.20), 128.42 (128.40), and 128.45 (128.451); to enact new sections 128.22, 128.25, 128.26, 128.27, 128.42, and 128.45 and sections 128.05, 128.21, 128.211, 128.212, 128.221, 128.23, 128.24, 128.241, 128.242, 128.243, 128.28, 128.41, 128.411, 128.412, 128.413, 128.414, 128.415, 128.416, 128.417, 128.418, 128.419, 128.421, 128.422, and 128.43; and to repeal sections 128.04, 128.09, 128.15, 128.25, 128.26, 128.27, 128.571, 4742.01, 4742.02, 4742.03, 4742.04, 4742.05, 4742.06, and 4742.07 of the Revised Code to make changes to the law governing 9-1-1 service and to repeal program requirements for emergency-service-telecommunicator training.

To amend section 4713.37 and to enact sections 4713.33 and 4713.331 of the Revised Code to enter into the Cosmetology Licensure Compact.

(Committee on Government Oversight recommends passage of substitute bill April 24, 2024)

Sub. S. B. No. 94 – Senators Brenner, Landis

To amend sections 317.13, 317.32, 317.36, 1113.13, 1337.04, 2329.02, 4505.104, 4511.01, 4513.61, 4513.62, 4513.63, 4513.64, 4513.65, 4513.66, 4513.69, and 5323.02 and to enact section 5301.234 of the Revised Code and to amend Section 413.10 of H.B. 33 of the 135th General Assembly to make various changes regarding recorded instruments, powers of attorney, judgment liens, mortgage subrogation, law enforcement towing laws, and state stock banks, and to make an appropriation.

To enact section 5534.761 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of Refugee Road in Fairfield County as the "Cpl. David A. Johnston Memorial Highway."

To amend sections 121.95, 1751.11, 2913.47, 3901.04, 3901.221, 3901.24, 3901.321, 3901.36, 3903.42, 3905.14, 3916.15, 3929.41, 3929.42, 3929.43, 3929.44, 3929.481, 3935.04, 3937.03, 3961.08, 4125.041, 4509.70, 5725.18, and 5729.02 and to enact sections 3901.411, 3970.01, 3970.02, 3970.03, 3970.04, 3970.05, 3970.06, 3970.07, and 3970.08 of the Revised Code regarding insurance regulations and taxes.

S. R. No. 296 – Senators Reineke, McColley

Cosponsors: Senators Brenner, Chavez, Johnson, Romanchuk, Cirino, Lang, Schaffer, Wilkin

To urge the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to withdraw its proposed regulations on greenhouse gas emissions and to urge the United States Congress to take action to prevent the regulations from taking effect.
