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ONE HUNDRED THIRTY-THIRD DAY Hall of the House of Representatives, Columbus, Ohio Wednesday, April 10, 2024, 9:00 o'clock a.m.

The hour having arrived for the meeting of the two houses in joint convention for the purpose of listening to the address of the Honorable Mike DeWine, Governor of the State of Ohio, before the joint convention.

The members of the Senate preceded by the President and Clerk appeared within the bar of the House.

The President of the Senate called the joint convention to order.

Senator McColley and Representative Oelslager announced that a quorum of each house, respectively, was present.

Prayer was offered by Reverend Vanessa Ward, from the Omega Baptist Church, Dayton, Ohio. The Ohio National Guard presented the colors, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and the posting of the colors.

The Governor was escorted to the rostrum by the committee appointed where he addressed the joint convention.

On motion of Senator McColley, the joint convention was dissolved.

The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 23, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Hoops was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.
